


2010 Wisconsin Rapids Planning Meeting





Reminiscing with the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1959 - The club participated in eleven meets and five exhibitions, where club members won at least one trophy at each meet. Wally Klager sent out a letter to all members thanking them for a great touring season.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1964 - The first swap meet sponsored by our club was held in 1964. The turnout was very poor, probably because of the Packers game played on the same day.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1969 - The Pagels organized a fall foliage tour through southwest Waukesha, the Kettle Moraine State Forest and back to North Prairie to the Pagels' home. Lunch and refreshments were enjoyed by everyone.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1974 - The club went on a scenic tour ending in Eagle at the Kettle Moraine Ranch where they enjoyed refreshments and an old-fashioned hay ride.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1979 - Two fall tours were scheduled. Members on the first tour saw the vibrant autumn colors in Muskego, ending at the county park. The second tour was a Ghost Gallop around Milwaukee's far northwest side, ending at Dretzke Park and Ski Chalet.



EVAPO-RUST

A Non Toxic Rust Remover

One of the problems faced by the Model A owner/restorer is rusty parts. When a part is found at a swap meet or elsewhere it usually needs to be cleaned of rust. In the past, the choices were a use of caustic chemicals or with expensive equipment like a sand blast cabinet. Another choice has been found. Harris International Laboratories has created Evapo-Rust. This is a non-toxic rust remover. The user does not need to wear rubber gloves and can immerse their hands in the product with out harm during use.

When first opened, the Evapo-Rust is clear. The parts are immersed in the Evapo-Rust and left for 30 minutes (or longer for heavier rusted items), according to the instructions. When the parts are removed, rinse with clear water. It is amazing to see the difference in the parts.


For our test we used a badly rusted and frozen oil pump drive gear assembly and water return gooseneck. The gooseneck was immersed half way to observe the before and after effect of the Evapo-Rust.



The parts were left for 18 hours since they were very rusty and frozen up. After a quick rinse, the parts were free of rust and the drive gear spun freely.

Evapo-Rust is reusable. The product will get darker with each use as it absorbs the rust from the parts, until it is black and no longer able to absorb any additional rust. Once it has become saturated, it can safely be disposed of by either pouring it down the drain, or using it as a fertilizer in the yard, since at this time it is mainly iron.
