
#### 2009 Wisconsin Rapids Planning Meeting





In Volume 1 Issue 3 of the Model A Times we reviewed various shock options for the Model A. In that article we came to the conclusion that rebuilt originals were the best option for the Model A owner. The conclusion came from the ability of the shock to be adjusted and the 60/40 operating system in the original shock. Well there is now an alternative to rebuilt original. While we have not tested these new shocks the information provided to us by Bill Stipe of Specialty Motor Cams, who has been providing excellent cams for the Model A hobby for years, has recently introduced a brand new original style shock replacement for the Model A Ford. These units include fully functioning needle adjustments for operational tension to adjust the firmness of the ride and the 60/40 action designed into the original shocks.

For the purist in the hobby the reservoir covers are designed with the same thread pattern and size as the original ,so the original covers may be installed in place of the covers supplied on the new shocks, for appearance and judging. We have included the release information and photos provided by Bill Stipe. His contact information is listed in the information. We look forward to installing these shocks on a car in the future so we can report on them in detail, as shocks are important in the overall ride comfort and safety in the Model A and often times overlooked in the restoration process.

# KRW SHOCK ABSORBER TESTING MACHINE No. A387 PRICE \$35.00 F. O. B. Factory-Arcade, N. Y. The KRW Shock Absorber Tester enables the operator to quickly test and adjust them as accurately as they left the factory. We recom-mend testing each shock absorber on the car with the lever and weight. If it cannot be adjusted quickly, it should be removed and overhauled, using the equipovernatied, using the equip-ment illustrated on the op-posite page. Then make ad-justments and test the in-strument on this machine before replacing on the car. It is so convenient and the tests can be made so easily that a shock absorber in good working order can be adjusted and tested in less than one minute. The foot lever raises the weight to the position shown, with shock absorber arm in "up" shock absorber arm in "up" position, a lever is pressed and the TIMER indicates the number of seconds required to complete the stroke. If further adjustments are necessary the operation is repeated. The dial is also calibrated in dial is also calibrated in RED figures to show the correct adjustments at normal temperatures. A chart is included with each ma-chine to show corrections to be made according to variation in temperature. (If this machine is not used the test is made with the shock absorber mounted on the special bench fixture shown on opposite page, using the lever and weight for a test.) The head is for a test.) The head is swiveled to handle both right and left hand instru-ments. This new machine is as simple as it looks, nothas simple as it looks, nothing to get out of adjustment or cause trouble. It will save you time and money—and convince your customers beyond a doubt that you are properly equipped to handle this much needed service. Shipping Weight 180 Pounds Crated
