

Are you an expert at wood graining? I'm not. I have never even attempted it. If you have done it before, please come and guide us as we make an attempt at it.

Everything I read and everyone I talk to that has done it says it is easy. I guess we will find out how easy it is in November.

All of the supplies will be provided and you are encouraged to try your hand at wood graining.

If you have something that you would like wood grained, bring it to the October seminar or at the latest November 1st. I will apply the base coat so that all pieces will be ready for wood graining on the night of the seminar Nov. 16th.

Once the base coat is on the rest of the process is trial and error. If you don't like the results you simply wipe it off and try again until you like the results. After that a clear coat is applied to protect it and you are done.

You can bring anything you want. It doesn't have to be a Model A part. I will apply the base coat for you but you must bring items ready for paint. I won't be doing body work or paint prep. Remember, 90% of the paint work is preparation. Any defects in the surface will be magnified by the finish coats.

Come, learn and have fun. Who knows we might find a talent we didn't know we had.



The Prez's Notes—NOVEMBER 2006

In 2005, I was the "outdoor meet chairman" for our club. That sounds like a lofty title, but the core of the job is simply coordinating all of our club's warm-weather driving tours. What does coordinating mean? Making sure we have volunteer hosts for tours that the hosts are planning their tours, and that tour announcements get into our newsletter and website.

One thing I learned from the job was that many members in our club have no idea that hosting a tour is relatively easy.

Here's how it works:

During one of our winter indoor meets, a signup sheet will be passed around. The sheet lists open-tour dates and recurring events (like our annual trip to Sharon for Model A Days each June and the Lake Geneva Cancer Run each September). The open-tour dates are events like "mid-June tour" or "fall tour." These "open-tour" calendar dates are flexible, and additional tours are always welcome long after the sign-up sheet has come and gone.

Open-tour events require a modest amount of planning. Typically, tours involve driving to an interesting destination, or simply taking a scenic ride and stopping for refreshments at its conclusion. Sometimes folks get fancier, with events like "poker runs." There's also no harm in going to a destination our club has previously visited. Not everyone goes on every tour each time.

Two or three months before a tour our newsletter editor and our webmaster will be looking for information such as a name for the tour, a sentence or two about what the tour involves, a mention of any costs involved (admission fees, for example), and a meeting date, time, place and contact name and phone number.

Our club budgets \$300 per tour for snacks, beverages, and a rental hall to gather in after the tour, such as a clubhouse, recreation center, or park shelter. In general, the money is not to be spent on admission fees. The nature of the tour determines if this money is used or not.

On the day of the tour, hosts show up early at the meeting spot, take attendance, and pass out maps of the tour route (and sometimes breath a big sigh of relief that it isn't raining!).

After the tour is over, hosts send a short write-up of the event to the newsletter editor. If expenses are incurred, a reimbursement form is filled out (available on our website or from the outdoor meet coordinator).

That's all it takes. Not so hard, right? So if there's a place you've been hankering to visit, or a road you'd love to travel, please sign-up for an outdoor event! – Neil Besougloff



Super sneaky short cuts:

- 1. Use a hair dryer to speed dust books, artwork, and figurines. Vacuum up what ever falls to the floor




