





Prez notes for December 2008

A few weeks back I was exchanging emails with a friend in Missouri who is the previous owner of my Model A. In one of the emails he asked me how Miss Vicky was doing. While it only took a half second for me to understand what he was talking about – our Model A is a 1931 Victoria – it got me to thinking about what my family calls our Model A and what others in the club call their Model A's.

While our A is "Miss Vicky" to my friend, it is simply "the Model A" to our family. Call us uncreative, but my wife, my kids, and I never came up with a good nickname for the car when we bought it, and now it looks like it never will have a personalized name. (For the record, our family calls our two modern cars "Neil's car" and "Susy's car," showing an across-the-board lack of automotive naming creativity).

My friend in Missouri owns three Model A's, a roadster, a pickup truck, and his latest, a 1928 speedster. The speedster is named "Speedie" and wears its name on its license plates. I've never asked, but I bet that his roadster and pickup have nicknames, too.

It seems that few members in the Wisconsin Chapter have names for their cars, or at least names that they use in public. I can't recall any car nicknames being spoken aloud (well, at least worthy of publication!) during conversations or on club tours.

When I'm on the Internet reading postings on two of the larger Model A chat forums, ahooga.com and fordbarn.com, I occasionally run across car owners who have Model A's with nicknames. The origins of some nicknames are seemingly obvious, "Henry's Lady," "Sport," and "Big Red," for example. Other nicknames are more personalized, such as "Gertie," "Betsy," and "Clarence." Some of these names are inherited or share a connection to a previous, fondly remembered owner.

Perhaps the most widely known Model A nickname is the "Rambling Wreck" of Georgia Tech. Officially called the Georgia Institute of Technology, the school's spotless white-and-gold 1930 Model A has been its mechanical mascot since 1961. The

Wreck, which really isn't a wreck, leads the college's football team onto the field at home games.

If you've come across some interesting nicknames for Model A's in our club, let me know and I'll try to add them to the next President's Notes column.

And speaking of names, as of the November indoor meet we have three names nominated for the 2009 board of directors: Dave Boucher, Mark Ackermann, and Bob Davisson. We need two more names to fill the five board vacancies, and for our club to have a true election in January we need six or more names total. If you are interested in helping guide the direction of our club in the coming year, or you know someone who is, be sure to attend December's indoor meet Dec. 21 at St. Aloysius Church in West Allis. Board nominations close at the end of the December meeting. If you cannot attend but have a nomination, please let any board member know right away. – Neil Besougloff



Reminiscing with the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1958 - At a regular monthly meeting, Demo Staver made a motion that our club dissolve as it now stands and join the MAFC of California. Member Wally Klager was nominated to travel to California as MAFC representative. Mr. Klager returned well impressed and enthused about MAFCA organizational ability. Upon Wally Klager's recommendation, it was decided (after much consideration) that to better our own members cause, as well as all restorers nationally, that one big club with good leadership and guidance was better than many and varied clubs. Our club MAFC had five of our officers join MAFCA and then petitioned for a regional charter, and it was granted. This is how "America" was added to the Model A Ford Club.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1963 - 7 families in Model A's and 4 in modern iron gathered at Capitol Court Shopping Center and were off like the wind to the focal point of the tour, the Brook Stevens Auto Museum.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1968 - The Christmas party was held at Alonzo Cudworth Post. Santa brought a red stocking filled with candy for all the kids.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1973 - The family of the month was Web and Ethel Bloedorn and their five children.

HEAD STUD DRILL GUIDE


TOOL

This tool is a drill guide for a 29/64th bit to drill out a head stud for installation of a Heli-Coil. There is also a 3/16th insert drill guide to center drill a broken stud.

The drill guide tool includes the 29/64th drill bit guide, an insert sleeve for the 3/16th drill guide, and a 3/16th guide drill bit.

The drill guide is placed over the stud hole to be drilled. One of the three holes on the back side of the tool will line up with another stud hole. Use a 7/16-14 x 1" bolt through one of the three holes in the tool, into a stud hole to hold the tool rigid for drilling. For a broken stud, insert the 3/16" guide in the tool and use the provided 3/16 bit to drill a pilot hole. Remove the 3/16 guide and use a 29/64 bit to drill out the damaged threads. Tap the hole for a 7/16-14 Helicoil.

This Tool will be available at most major parts suppliers in June 2008.




3/16th Pilot Guide


29/64th Bit Guide

Broken Stud Hole Center Drilled with Guide Tool


2009 Wisconsin Rapids Planning Meeting



A brief history of The Model T Ford Snowmobile

(I know we are a Model A Club, but found this interesting)

The Snowmobile Company, Inc. – West Ossipee, NH

Burr!!! Old Man Winter made his unwelcome return to the North Country. Coaxing the sleepy Model T out of the shed would take a major effort, now. Jack up one rear wheel, push the brake lever all the way ahead, pour hot wa-



ter into the radiator, and start cranking. Trying to push the magnets of the flywheel through the molasses-like oil in the pan made one wonder if the trip to town couldn't wait until spring. Time to drain the oil into a can and set it on the cook stove for a spell.

In 1917 Virgil D. White received a patent for an attachment designed to convert a Model T into a 'Snowmobile,' a name coined and copyrighted by White. White, a Ford dealer in Ossipee, New Hampshire, built his first snowmobile attachment 1913.

He put it on the market during the winter of 1922 after 'perfecting it in every detail,' selling the attachments exclusively through Ford dealers. The Snowmobile attachment consisted of the complete package necessary to convert a Ford into a reliable snow machine. Skis made of metal and wood and rear mounted tracks were the most noticeable differences.

The standard passenger car rear axle and driveshaft, rear spring, and radius rods were removed and replaced with a 7 to 1 Ford truck worm gear drive line attached to the frame by a pair of cantilevered semi-elliptical springs. Special heavy-duty wheels to fit the TT rear axle were provided along with anti-skip chains.

The earliest units sold by White included tracks made of metal cleats joined by a heavy fabric. White later switched to all metal tracks consisting of stamped steel shoes connected by chain links. Additions to the Snowmobile attachment in later years included a special box attached to the left frame for the battery displaced by the idler axle. A cast iron step sporting the Snowmobile insignia took the place of running boards, which were removed to allow room for the track system. The "Ford on Snowshoes," was offered in three different gauges.

For those living where automobiles were standard 56 inch gauge was recommended. A narrower 44-inch gauge allowed driving the Ford in the tracks of horse-drawn bobsleds. Thirty-eight inch gauge was offered for Ford owners where narrower sleigh tracks were standard, such as in parts of Canada. A special slip-on body of hard maple with four coats of paint was included as part of the narrow gauge packages.

The Snowmobile became an indispensable convenience for the person requiring rapid, dependable transport in all kinds of weather. Country doctors and rural mail carriers were the largest users of this type of vehicle. Other customers of the manufactured Snowmobile included public utility companies, lumber companies, traveling salesmen, fire departments, school bus and taxi drivers, undertakers, grocers, milkmen, truckers and cranberry

growers. When the father of President Calvin Coolidge died on March 18, 1926, a Model T Snowmobile led the Coolidge funeral procession over the snow-covered hills of Vermont.

Makers of the two and a half feet of unbroken snow at an average speed of 18 miles per hour. Those who had a Snowmobile certainly used it with great satisfaction. The conversion kits were quite expensive. The attachment in 44 inch or 38 inch gauge for mounting on a roadster, or the 56 inch gauge for all body styles prior to 1926, listed at \$395.00 F.O.B., West Ossipee, *continued on next page*

New Hampshire. A 56-inch gauge attachment for the one ton truck was less expensive at \$250.00 because no special driveline and suspension were needed. Heavy duty 30 x 30-1/2-inch - wheels were still provided to mount on the rear axle, however.

With skis removed and front wheels installed; the Snowmobile became a Sandmobile, useful for transport through deep mud and heavy sand. A number of units sold as Sandmobiles were used in South Africa, Algeria, Egypt, and the Florida Everglades.

In 1923, White produced only about 70 units. By 1925, manufacturing rights to produce snow automobile attachments were sold to Farm Specialty Manufacturing Company of New Holstein, Wisconsin, which began to market its version of the product in 1926.

Farm Specialty Manufacturing Company later bought the patents of the Snowmobile Company and sent its managers to run the factory in West Ossipee. From 1924 to 1929, the Snowmobile Company manufactured about 3,300 units per year in its plant at West Ossipee and had a branch warehouse at St. Paul, Minnesota. The Snowmobile Company closed in 1929, and the factory mysteriously burned down shortly thereafter.
