Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

4.) **The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 1:00 pm. THIS IS MANDATORY OR YOU ARE JEOPARDIZING YOUR SPOT FOR FUTURE EVENTS.**

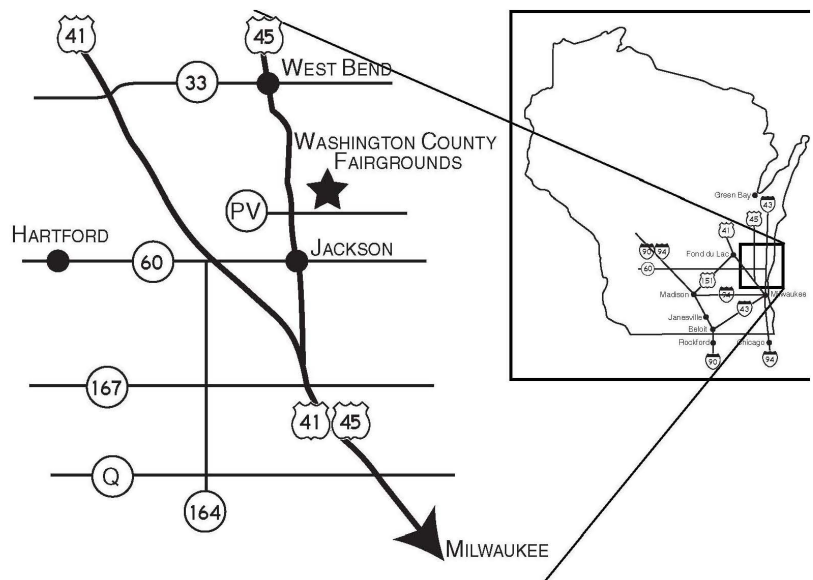
5.) Vendors **MUST** vacate building by 4:00 p.m.

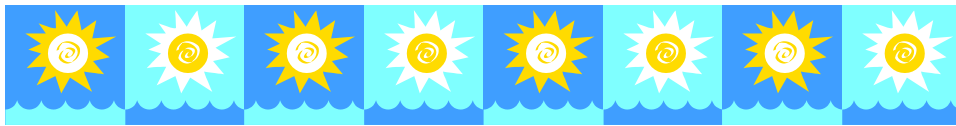

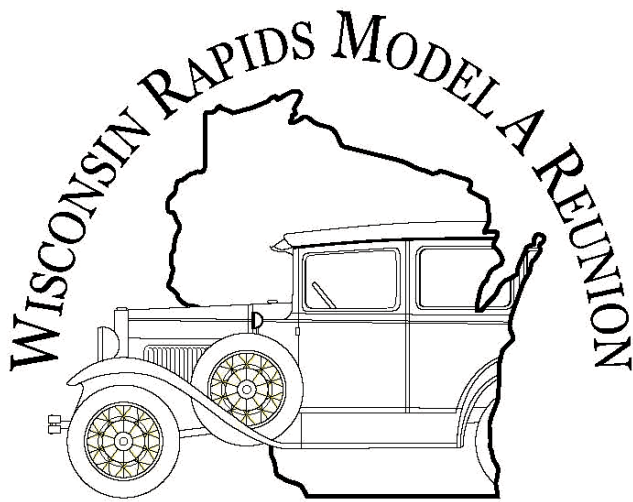

## 60th Annual July 29-30-31, 2022

Hello everyone! For those who are not aware, my name is Paul Thomas Sillman, and I am the Chairman of the 60th Wisconsin Rapids Model "A" Reunion taking place in 2022. I am very excited and honored to be doing this again for the Wisconsin Region MARC, and will do my best to make sure that this Reunion will be the best yet.

During our planning meeting, it was however brought to our attention that many jobs on the duty roster were being neglected or unfilled, leading to a few people doing the work of many people all weekend. The meet chairman of the last Reunion, along with his wife, were chasing people down to sign up for jobs. In light of this information, we are going to be trying out something new this year.

After the meeting, we divided up the duty roster into jobs, and then divided those jobs into the 4 different clubs. What we are having each club do is have one member volunteer to be a "Captain" of that club's list of duties. It is then that person's job to find volunteers for doing the jobs assigned to that club. These volunteers do not need to come solely from the Captain's clubs, they can recruit from other clubs. It is our hope that by doing this way, we will be able to find help and volunteers well before the Reunion begins.

Much like how the lunch cooking and cleanup jobs rotate each year between the clubs, each club will have different duties each year, depending on where they are in the host-rotation.

For those who don't know, this year my club, Wisconsin Region, will be chairing the event. CWC is the Second-Up, and will be co-chair this year, and chair next year. Third-Up is the Wisconsin Chapter, and then finally Nickle A is the Fourth-Up.

It should also be noted here, if we cannot or do not get

volunteers for these duties, the Reunion will not be taking place. I personally do not hope that it comes to that, but if it needs to, it will. The person and club in charge of these duties does not need to do them alone, nor is expected to, but is just responsible for making sure that they can find volunteers for doing each of these duties. Some of these duties can be done by just one person, some require a few more. We have run the numbers and have a rough idea on how many people generally do each job.

The chairing club is responsible for the setting up the tents and keeping the refreshment areas clean, which includes stocking and filling the soda, beer and coffee. They are also in charge of registration and fundraising, which will be the raffles and the auction, and ordering awards for the weekend. Finally they will also be responsible for cleaning up after Saturday's lunch.

The co-chair club will be in charge of our Technical Seminar, as well as the tour on Saturday, grilling the food for the cookouts, and the Sunday post lunch cleanup.

The Third-Up club will be in charge of garbage pickup for the weekend and running the car games, chapter team events and rolling pin toss. They will also handle the Saturday lunch prep and Clubhouse cleaning.

The Fourth-Up club is the one that was the chair of the previous Reunion. This club is responsible for making sure the toilets are kept clean and stocked, as well as running the kids games, ski race, Hubley Derby and Sunday's lunch prep.

It should also be noted here that the "captain" of each club is also in charge of assembling teams from their clubs for the chapter team events, and giving that information to the person in charge of car games.

We will be providing a detailed list of what each duty entails to each club in their newsletter, as well as how many people are recommended for each duty. Again each person volunteering to be the "Captain" is not responsible for each of these duties, but is responsible for finding volunteers for each of these duties. If we do not get enough volunteers, we will not be having a Reunion in 2022, and I'm sure many of us do not want that. Our cutoff date for finding "Captains" will be January 30th, 2022.

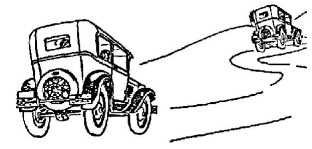

Crust	Topping
2 cups all-purpose flour	2/3 cup butter or margarine
3/4 cup brown sugar	1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup softened butter	1/2 - 3/4 cup semisweet chocolate
1 1/2 cups pecan pieces	pieces

Crust: combine flour, brown sugar and butter; beat at medium speed 2-3 minutes. Press into ungreased 13 x 9 baking pan, place pecans evenly across unbaked crust.



Topping: In a small saucepan combine butter and brown sugar. Cook over medium heat until mixture begins to boil. Boil 1 minute, stirring constantly. Pour over crust. Bake at 350 degrees in center of oven for 18 – 22 minutes or until topping is bubbly and crust is light golden brown. Remove from oven and (while still hot) sprinkle on chocolate chips; do not spread. Cool on wire racks. Cut into bars. Makes about 3 1/2 dozen.

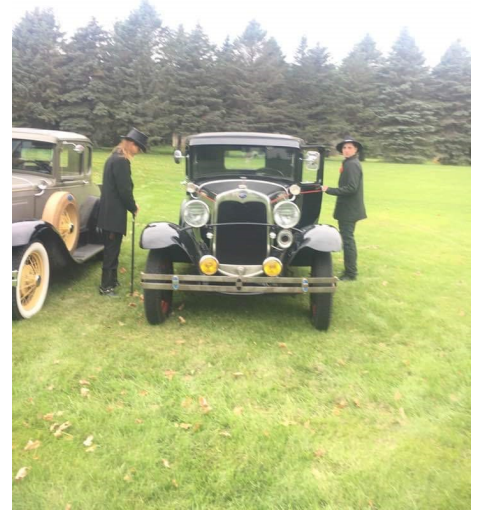

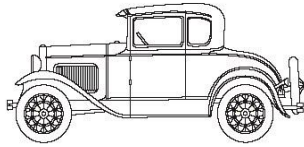
