

Nose work is an upcoming and fun canine sport / activity.

Nose work, also called scent work, is a companion dog sport where dogs are able to use their innate and amazing sense of smell and natural hunt drive, to find "hides" in a variety of locations and environments requiring a range of problem-solving skills. Based on professional dog detection, nose work uses essential oils as target odors. These odors include birch, anise, clove, cypress and vetiver. It's a fun and addictive sport as handler start to understand and appreciate the beauty of this incredible talent dogs have to detect and follow a miniscule vapor of odor back to its source. Dogs love it because it's what they are born to do regardless of age, breed, temperament, size or condition. It has been demonstrated that shy, fearful, and even reactive dogs can build the confidence to help overcome some of their challenges in the engagement of this highly enriching game.


We'll take you through benefits of nose work, its history, how dogs smells compared to humans, interesting facts and how a dog searches.

Each vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and are \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, but may <u>not to be used for selling car parts.</u> The spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

- 1.) Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2023, however your payment and completed application <u>must be returned by November 10, 2023</u> to insure your same space(s).
- 2.) After November 10, 2023 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ASSIGN VENDOR LOCATION. WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.</u>
- 3.) First space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands. For each additional space the vendor will receive 1 wrist band per space. A limit of six spaces.
- 4.) Vendors MUST vacate building by 3:00 p.m.
- 5.) Spots are not guaranteed due to circumstances beyond our control.

You will receive a letter shortly after January 10, 2024, confirming your building, space location, your arrival time and wrist bands for your space(s). <u>Please arrive at your designated time only.</u> Wearing your wrist band is <u>required</u> the day of the show.

If you are interested in running for the Board of Directors contact me. We will need 2 people to come onto the board for 2024.



# Who was Edsel Ford?



Edsel Ford was born in November 1893 in Detroit. He was the only child of Clara and Henry Ford, being named for Edsel Ruddiman, one of Henry Ford's closest childhood friends. Edsel went to The Hotchkiss School, in Lakeville, Connecticut, and the Detroit University School. His family has donated to both institutions and the school library at Hotchkiss is named the Edsel Ford Memorial Library.

He was groomed to take over the family automobile business, and grew up tinkering on cars with his father. He became secretary of Ford in 1915, and married Eleanor Lowthian Clay (1896–1976), the niece of department store owner J. L. Hudson, on November 1, 1916. Together, they had four children: Henry Ford II, Benson Ford, Josephine Clay Ford, and William Clay Ford. They made their home at 2171 Iroquois Street, in the Indian Village neighborhood of Detroit.

In 1929, the Ford family moved into Gaukler Point, their new home designed by Albert Kahn, on the shores of Lake St. Clair in Grosse Pointe Shores, Michigan. The estate's gardens were designed by landscape architect Jens Jensen with his traditional long view, giving visitors a glimpse of the residence down the long meadow before revealing the entire house at drive's end. He also designed the gardens for Edsel and Eleanor's summer estate, Skylands in Seal Harbor on Mount Desert Island in Maine.

Edsel showed more interest than his father in flashier styling for automobiles and after becoming the president of Ford (1919), he advocated for the introduction of a more modern automobile to replace the Model T, but was repeatedly overruled by his father. He often disagreed with his father on major decisions, who occasionally humiliated him in public. Due to a dwindling market share the introduction of a new model was finally inevitable; the Model A.

During the design of the Model A in 1927, Henry Ford assured mechanical quality and reliability, allowing his son to develop the body, with the help of designer József Galamb. Edsel also prevailed upon his father to allow the inclusion of four-wheel mechanical brakes and a sliding-gear transmission on this model. The resulting Model A was a commercial success, selling over four million during four years of production.

Edsel also had an affinity for sports cars, which was demonstrated in his personal vehicles: Edsel bought the first MG motorcar imported to the US. In 1932, he had an aluminum, boat-tailed speedster automobile custom-designed by Ford's first designer, E. T. (Bob) Gregorie and featuring Ford's brand-new V8, the first low-cost, eight-cylinder engine. This car was sold at an auction during the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance in 1976.


The relationship between the father and son was always close, but always fraught with unhealthy aspects. In spite of this, Edsel managed to introduce many lasting changes. In 1922 he purchased the Lincoln Motor Com-



pany. He also founded and named the Mercury division. He was responsible for the Lincoln-Zephyr and Continental. He significantly strengthened Ford Motors' overseas production, and modernized the company's cars, such as by introducing hydraulic brakes

As an early and enthusiastic advocate for aviation, Edsel insisted that the Ford Company should develop airplanes, over the initial objections of his father, who could not envision commercial applications for planes. After having huge success as the US Post Office's airmail carrier, Edsel's foresight was rewarded. The company was able to respond to the critical need for airplanes during WW2.

The Ford Motor Company played a key role in the arming of the US "Arsenal of Democracy". With Edsel leading the company, he set the goal of producing one bomber per hour at Ford's expansive Willow Run manufacturing complex, where the B-24 was produced. It was said that the stress of this job caused Edsel to become mortally ill.



Edsel Ford developed metastatic stomach cancer and undulant fever. Surgery for the cancer was unsuccessful due to the metastasis. Ford died in 1943 at Gaukler Point, in his lakeside home in Grosse Pointe Shores, at the age of 49. All of Edsel Ford's nonvoting stock was donated to the Ford Foundation, which he had founded with his father seven years earlier. He is buried at Woodlawn Cemetery in Detroit. His wife Eleanor continued living in their home until her death in 1976. It was her wish that the property be used for "the benefit of the public." The Edsel and Eleanor Ford House is now open to the public. Located on 87 acres, the house has an excellent collection of the Fords' original antiques and art, and the historical landscape grounds on the lakefront. The museum currently hosts tours, classes, lectures, and special events. The property is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Each of Edsel Ford's children inherited sizable shares in the Ford Motor Company, and the three sons all worked in the family business. On Edsel's death, his father briefly reassumed the presidency of Ford, then Edsel's son, Henry Ford II, became president of the company on September 21, 1945.

Edsel Ford was one of the most significant art benefactors in Detroit history. As president of the Detroit Arts Commission, he commissioned the famous Diego Rivera Detroit Industry Murals in the Detroit Institute of Arts (DIA). He was an early collector of African art and his contributions became part of the core of the original DIA African art collection. After his death, his family continued to make significant contributions. He also helped finance exploratory expeditions, including the historic flight of Admiral Richard Byrd over the North Pole in 1926 as well as Byrd's Antarctic expeditions.

In September 1957, Ford Motor Company unveiled a new division of cars called Edsel. The Edsel division included the Citation, Corsair, Pacer, Ranger, Bermuda, Villager, and Roundup models. The Edsel division is remembered as a significant commercial failure. The cars sold moderately well in their first year, but the Edsel division was discontinued soon after the 1960 models were introduced.
