

### **Road Trip to Gilmore Car Museum**



Latest Update!!!

Progress continues with our May tour to the Gilmore Museum in Hickory Corners. We have the Badger Ferry booked for their opening day crossing on May 12<sup>th</sup>. All partic ipants will be rendez-vousing at the Gearheads Warehouse in Sheboygan at 10 am on the 12<sup>th</sup>. We'll have coffee and sweet rolls, plus a chance to "freshen up". Once everyone is accounted for, we will head north to Manitowoc for a quick burger and arrive at the Badger Dock no later than 1 p.m. for loading. The boat departs at 2 pm and arrives in Ludington at 7 p.m. (eastern time). It takes about ½ to unload from the Ferry, then its off to the "House of Flavors" Restaurant, https://www.houseofflavorsrestaurants.com where they serve great family meals and feature 40 flavors of Ice Cream!

As of this writing, we have narrowed down lodging for the night of the 12<sup>th</sup> in Ludington, will have more in February. Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> we depart for the Gilmore Museum, about 140 miles. We picked a winner of a weekend! They are planning to have vintage "Boats in the Barn," A Vintage Travel Trailer Rally, and for you aficionados, there is also a Craft Beer and Wine tasting! Tickets may be purchased on site or in advance, \$14/day. We have a confirmed booking at the Baymont by Wyndham Battle Creek Downtown, 182 West Van Buren, Battle Creek, Michigan 49017 +1-269-565-0500 Rates are \$109/night plus 11% Tax Friday and Saturday. Sunday rate \$70 plus 11% tax. I would encourage you to book NOW as Gilmore will have much going on and you may not get a room otherwise! Mention the WI Model A Ford Club to get the special rate!

We will spend Friday afternoon, Saturday and possibly Sunday touring this immense campus, so much to see and do! We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.



- 2.) After November 7, 2021 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ASSIGN VENDOR LOCATION.</u> WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.
- 3.) Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to 6, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. Each space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands.
- 4.) The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 1:00 pm. THIS IS MANDITORY OR YOU ARE JEOPARDIZING YOUR SPOT FOR FUTURE EVENTS.

## 60th Annual Model A Reunion July 29th-30th-31st, 2022

**This Model "A" Reunion** is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, Adult Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

**Location:** The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

#### **Weekend Activities**

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

**Good Food:** A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

**Friday** afternoon the registration table opens. An Auction will be held in the evening of Model A related items, as well as other donated items for the kids, ladies, and men. There will also be a corn and pizza roast. Registration does not cover cost of Pizza or Corn.

# 'A' Trip Back to February 1929



Can anyone think of February and not think about Valentine's Day? In thinking about Valentine's Day and this historical article, it set me looking for some things of interest about the day and the month.

It seems that February 1929 was a significant milestone for Ford, and February 14, 1929, was historically significant in a not-such-a-good way.

For the Ford Motor Company, 1929 was the largest production period in the Model A's life cycle reaching 1,507,132 units of production. The first one-millionth Model A was completed on February 4<sup>th</sup>, 1929. Makes you wonder if it is still running today and who has it.

And then there is the infamous Saint Valentine's Day Massacre. This was the murder of seven members and associates of Chicago's North Side Gang that occurred on St. Valentine's Day 1929. The men were gathered at a Lincoln Park, Chicago area, garage on the morning of February 14<sup>th</sup>. They were lined up against a wall and shot by four unknown assailants, two dressed as police officers. The incident resulted from the struggle to control organized crime in the city during Prohibition between the Irish North Siders, headed by George "Bugs" Moran and their Italian Chicago outfit rivals led by Al Capone, also known as "Scarface." The perpetrators have never been conclusively identified, but former members of the Egan's Rats gang working for Capone ware suspected of having a role, as were members of the Chicago Police Department who allegedly wanted revenge for the killing of a police officer's son.\* Alphonse Capone is noted to be the most famous American gangster of all time and he drove a 1928 Model A Town Sedan.

Valentine's Day is the most popular birth date between January 1 and July 1, according to the Daily Viz, possibly because more people choose that day to give birth if they have a choice. The average number of births on Valentine's Day (taken over the course of two decades of birth data 2/6/18) is 11,636. Some notable people born on Valentine's Day include Freddie Highmore, the "Good Doctor," and Florence Henderson/Carol Brady of The Brady Bunch. Jack Benny, Teller (of Penn and Teller), and Hugh Downs were also Valentine babies.

Then there is a bit of history about how this day came about that I found intriguing. Seems the Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine. Although the truth behind the Valentine legend is murky, the stories all emphasize their appeal as a sympathetic, heroic, romantic figure. They all were martyred for doing good things for people--so one might need Cupid's arrow to choose the actual namesake. One fact or legend suggests that an imprisoned Valentine sent the first valentine greeting signed "From your Valentine" after he fell in love with the jailor's daughter, who visited him during confinement.

And the date of the 14<sup>th</sup> seems to be chosen to commemorate the anniversary of Valentine's death ......Or to Christianize the pagan celebration of Lupericalia, a fertility festival dedicated to the Roman god of agriculture.


