Cold Weather Hints To Fordowners

Gasoline vaporizes much more slowly in cold weather and this is the main reason a motor is hard to start in winter.

- 1. If you have trouble starting try this:
 - (a) Open carburetor adjustment on dash by turning to the left about ½ turn.
 - (b) Before turning on ignition switch, pull out "priming" or choke wire and turn motor over a few times.
 - (c) Then turn on ignition switch, turn motor over and it will start.
 - (d) When motor is warm, turn carburetor adjustment back to original position.

In extremely cold weather it may be necessary to open the carburetor adjustment as much as 2 or 3 times before starting.

- 2. Keep your battery well charged. The greater the charge the more cold it will stand.
- 3. Use alcohol or non-freezing solution in your radiator when the temperature is below freezing. Remember without it your radiator may freeze even with the motor running.
- 4. Change cylinder oil more frequently (every 500 miles) as gasoline condensation is greater in cold weather, and this destroys the lubricating quality of your cylinder oil.



Automatic Battery Charger/Maintainer

While attending the Automotive Aftermarket Parts Expo in Las Vegas we found the Battery Doctor. While battery chargers and maintainers have been around for sometime finding one that is dual voltage was unique. This compact and inexpensive Battery Doctor is switchable from 6 volt to 12 volt. So a hobbyist has the ability to move the charger from his Model A to his snowmobile during the off seasons. This is convenient and cost effective, plus you only have one charger to keep track of.



The Model A Times picked up a unit at a local Grainger for about \$44. The unit comes with cables for clip-on and ring connectors for hard wiring the unit. This really is an excellent product for the Model A owner who may have additional batteries to maintain but in 12 volt rather than 6 volt requiring you to buy two chargers.

One thing to take note of, there was a seal over the 6-12 volt switch with the warning that removing the seal indicates the owner knows enough to switch the unit from 6 to 12 and back when hooking up the charger. So this unit is not automatic, the owner has to be aware of their cars voltage when connecting the charger.




We opted to use the permanent wiring on the installation for the roadster. This attaches a set of wires to the battery terminal that contain a fuse. We ran the wires out to the engine compartment and clipped them to the frame. Now when the car is not being used the Battery Doctor is easily connected. When the car is being used the other set of cables can be attached to the Battery Doctor, making it useable as either a 6 or 12 bolt charger a very nice touch.
