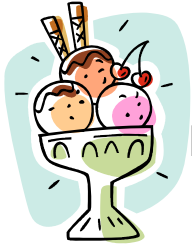

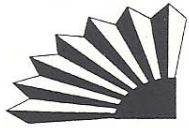

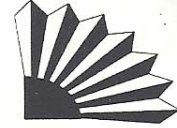
Reminiscing with the Historian

HAPPY NEW YEAR TO ALL!!



On New Years Eve the snow came down.
And covered every inch of town.
The next day winter sheets of white.
Invited us to come and write.
Our resolutions in the snow.
So everyone in town would know.
Of all the thing we planned to do.
To make the year completely new.

Now that winter is really here, do you remember how many bad snow storms we did have? I remember in 1936 I was 11 years old, we had one storm so bad that the snow was so high that it touched the power lines. We had to take our neighbors mail and Milwaukee Journal to him. We walked on the top of the snow.

In 1947, the first year we were married, we lived in Menomonee Falls and the kids built tunnels on the sidewalk so people could walk through. They sure enjoyed this. It was blocked for a few days. And now, we would ask our children to do something like that and it would be a chore to them. My parents always said "Enjoy the snow because when summer comes, don't holler about how hot it is" No air conditioning in those days.

New Year's was celebrated not only on January 1, but some choose the day for their New Year's. Some American Indians started New Years when food was ready to be harvested. They would wait till acorns were ripe and the salmon would be running in the streams. Egyptians started their New Year when the Nile River flooded. Some waited until spring when the trees were growing leaves. Jewish people have their New Year sometime between September 6 and October 5. It is not the same time every year. The Chinese New Year is between January 21 and February 19. So, no matter where you are, on that day marked January 1 on your calendar, someone will say Happy New Year in their own words and language.

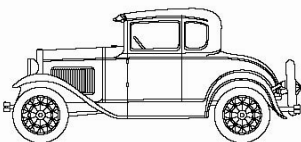
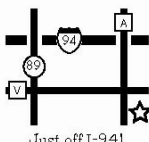

Technical meets continue with tires and alignment

More than 25 club members turned out for the November technical meet, where we learned how to align a Model A front end and also how to mount tires using plastic trash bags as a “lubricant.”

The bags, just plain old plastic trash bags, are laid flat over rims to help reduce friction between the rim’s edge and the bead of a new tire as the tire is worked around the rim with tire irons and good old-fashioned muscle. After one set of tires was mounted we learned how to use a bubble-balance tool to properly balance the tires using stick-on weights.

The winter technical meet season will continue on Thursday, Jan. 19, with a patch-panel session. Join us to learn how to repair damaged or rusted panels on your car.

On Thursday, Feb. 16, we will learn how to repair a two-tooth steering box.

March’s meet will be Thursday, March 15.
