

We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, <u>spot not to be used for selling car parts.</u> Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.


- 1.) Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2020, however your payment and completed application <u>must be returned us by November 7, 2021</u> to insure your same space(s).
- 2.) After November 7, 2021 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ASSIGN VENDOR LOCATION.</u> WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.
- 3.) Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to 6, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. Each space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands.
- 4.) The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 1:00 pm. THIS IS MANDITORY OR YOU ARE JEOPARDIZING YOUR SPOT FOR FUTURE EVENTS.
- 5.) Vendors MUST vacate building by 4:00 p.m.

#### **Great Race Coming to Wisconsin**

I was fortunate enough to be in the Great Race from 2003 to 2006. The first year I was pit-crew and web master for a '29 Model A Woody out of West Bend WI. The second and third year I was crew-chief and web master for the same car. The fourth year I was the driver, with a '29 Model A Phaeton from Walla Walla WA, driving for a friend that I had met at previous events.

The Great Race is an antique, vintage and collector car road rally, not a test of top speed. The course tests the team's ability to follow precise course instructions and the car's ability to endure a cross-country trip. No traffic laws are ever broken, at least none that the Great Race asked you to do.

For 2021, the cars had to be 1974 and older. When I was in it, they needed to be stock, with some exceptions for speed and safety, now they are allowing street rods. Each car is thoroughly inspected by the Great Race.

GPS, computers and other electronics are not permitted, and odometers are taped over. Cell phones are sealed in bags, opening the bag disqualifies the team for the day. Anyone with AC will have that feature disabled for the race.

The 2021 entry cost, for a private team, was \$6000. This covered just your entry, it did not cover the gas, lodging, food and transportation costs for your team.

Teams consist of a driver and navigator. The driver drives the car and gets directions from the navigator. The navigator gives the directions, keeping an eye on the clock and making adjustments to speeds and times. Most teams also have a pit-crew of at least one person. They are the mechanic, bell-hop, nurse-maid and whatever else is needed to keep the team on-track.

While the car is out on the course, the pit-crew cannot near it, or they'll be disqualified for the day. Any problems with the car must be solved by the team in the car, or it will be towed in by *The Grim Reaper*.

The participants start their day gathered around a shortwave radio broadcasting the official time. This is the time that everyone on the Great Race uses.

The teams receive the daily instructions, exactly 30 minutes before they leave, one minute apart from each other. These have every turn, speed change, stop, and start that they must make that day. Along the route there will be from 4 to 7 checkpoints that records the exact time the team passes that point. They need

to reach each checkpoint at the correct time, and their score is the result of their ability to follow the instructions precisely. Every second off the perfect time is a penalty point, you want a score of zero.

The starting point is a good place to see the cars and teams in action, getting ready for the day's events. It is not a good place to necessarily strike up conversation with them, as they have their minds on other things.

Following a tire warm up and speedometer calibration of about 15 miles, the teams will enter into the timed rallying portion of the course. Leaving in one minute increments, they will traverse the back hilly and twisted roads. If you see the cars on this portion, you should see a car go by every minute. This is not a good place to stop and chat with them.

For lunch, the cars will pull into town, announced as they come in and then go into the Parc Fermé. This is a French racing term, a secure car park where competing cars must be left, and where no maintenance, repairs or enhancements may be performed, for example during rest periods. The cars are parked, without ropes or stanchions to keep everyone away. This is a good place to see the cars, take photos and possibly talk with the driver and navigator.

Depending on what's been planned, there may be a car show hosted by an area car club. This would have to be planned by the car club getting in touch with who is hosting the stop, the Great Race does not plan the local car club's car show.

Following lunch, there will be more timed rallying sessions, again on the back roads.

When the teams reach the destination city, the teams are announced as they pull in, given their scores and go into another Parc Fermé. This is the first time that the whole team has been together since that morning, and the driver can let the pit-crew know of any problems. This is a good place to meet the teams, take photos and ask them questions. Again, depending on planning, there may be a car show hosted by a local car club.

If the car is in need of repair, it will need to wait until after the Parc Fermé, and the cars are at the motel.

The next day, it all starts over again, as the Great Race moves on to the next set of towns.

This is definitely worth scheduling the time to go and see this event and the cars. The Great Race has gone through Wisconsin before, but this is unique with it passing so close to our area. Check out their web site for more information and videos.

He encouraged the membership to volunteer to be on the Board of Directors and host events. Robert Sturtzen and Tony Koconis were nominated to be on the Board of Directors. Nominations were then closed. A motion was made by Mike Yokofich and seconded by Dennis Cooper to accept these two members for the Board of Directors. The motion was put to a vote and it was carried. Karen Schmiechen talked about today's event.

#### Highlights from the Planning Meeting for the clubs to share with membership and put in newsletters

- The 2022 Reunion dates are July 29th to 31st.
- The Reunion has moved to a new web site, it is now at www.wirapidsmodela.com.
- Please pre-register, and save \$5. A pre-registration form is in this mailing and is also on the web site.
- The road running in front of the clubgrounds, 72nd Street North, is now paved.
- The 2021 Fund-raising auction made \$1117. Please help out by donating good usable items to this event. Doesn't need to be Model A stuff, but that is always appreciated. Don't forget about items for the kids.
- The 2021 Raffle brought in \$389. This year, it will be replaced by a 50/50 drawing. Purchase as many tickets as you want for a chance to win half the pot.
- The 2021 Basket Raffle brought in \$782. Each club needs to donate a \$30 value Basket for this fundraiser. Clubs may donate more than one basket, and individuals may also donate. Baskets do not need to be elaborate.
- Look on Pinterest for some good Basket Raffle themes. There is a listing in the planning meeting notes that show how different themes went over.
- All of our Fund-raisers help to keep the cost of the Reunion affordable for everyone. Please participate in these events by donating items and buying them.
- You do not need to be a Model A Club member to participate in the Reunion, the Model A is optional also.
- Rooms in the Rapids area go fast, reserve yours today.
- We ask that all participants wear their club's name tags, so that names can be learned. Name tags may be borrowed from Registration, please return afterward.
- Please list the first and last names of all participants that you are registering on the registration form. This is to help with the issuing of awards.
- All participants 16 years and older need to sign up for a job duty to help out over the weekend. If people don't start signing up, we will have to look into other ways of getting volunteers.
- To help ensure that participants are signing up to help out over the weekend, the duty roster has been divided up between the clubs. The jobs assigned to the clubs aren't meant to be done solely by that club, they have to make sure that the jobs are being signed up for.
- Before the Dance on Saturday, *The Rumbleseat Ramblers*, who made their debut at the 2021 Reunion, will be performing a variety of songs at the Clubhouse. This will run from 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm.
- This Lady Drives a Model A is a course designed to show participants how to drive a Model A from someone other than a relative by birth or marriage. Schedule a time to do this.

- The corn roast will be on Friday, from 5:00-6:30, or until the supply runs out. \$1 an ear.
- The Pizza Roast, held at the same time as the Corn Roast on Friday night. Pizza will be sold at \$1/slice. Once the pizza is gone, it is gone.
- Shoe Box Swap Meet will be Saturday morning. Bring what fits in a shoe box, and swap/sell your items with other participants. Have your own change, as there will not be a banker on hand. All money raised is your own.
- The Slow Drive has been canceled this year, due to lack of participation.
- The Ski Race will be Saturday morning, and is open to the "older children" of the Reunion. Definition of "older" and "children" to be determined by self. Form a 3-person team, sign up at the club house.
- Please remember to bring an item each day to the Pot Luck line in a disposable container for easier clean up, or put your name on dish if you want it back. All items brought to Pot Luck must be ready to serve, this includes slicing of any fruits and vegetables. The serving staff does not have the space or time to finish your dish.
- With the exception of the Chapter Team Events, each licensed/temps registered participant can go through the car games once. If a participant does not have a Model A, one may be borrowed.
- Guests can participate in the Car Games, but they cannot participate in the Chapter Team Events.
- Car games this year will be Bull's Eye, Center Bumper and Blind Line.
- Chapter Team Events will be Bean Bag and Trailer Push. There'll be no practice round for these events, only a demo, so start practicing. Decide who will be doing these events for your club, teams need to be organized by the dance on Saturday.
- The areas in, under and within 15 feet of any structure used by the Reunion, whether a building or tent, are now Smoke/Vaping Free. This includes the clubhouse, overhang and any Reunion tents.
- Power has <u>not</u> been ran out to the camping area due to costs. Anyone who plugs into the clubhouse for power will be charged \$15. This will only be a 10-amp service.
- Members of a participating club cannot register as a guest of a registered participant.
- Day Pass participants are not allowed to participate in Award Issuing Events, such as the Ski Race, Hubley, Kids Games and Car Games.

# 60th Annual Model A Reunion July 29th-30th-31st, 2022

**This Model "A" Reunion** is the greatest gathering of old Fords and old Ford enthusiasts in Wisconsin. This Reunion started in 1962, and is sponsored by four clubs: Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA, Nickle A Region MARC, Wisconsin Chapter MAFCA, and the Wisconsin Region MARC.

The meet consists of a weekend of enjoying Model A's and Model A fellowship, and includes a Tour around the Rapids area, People's Choice Awards, Car Games, Kids' Games, Adult Games, a Hubley Derby, Chapter Team Events, Rolling Pin Toss, a Dance, Fund-Raising Auctions, Shoe Box Swap Meet, as well as lots of surprises and fun.

The Reunion is held the last full weekend in July, unless it conflicts with a National MARC or MAFCA meet. The Central Wisconsin Chapter MARC/MAFCA hosts the reunion on their private 10-acre site, which includes a clubhouse, wooded campsites, and is close to many nice motels and restaurants.

**Location:** The clubgrounds are located 4 miles east of Wisconsin Rapids, or 11 miles west of Plover, just south of state Highway 54. Turn south on 72nd Street North (a dead end road). Watch for signs.

#### **Weekend Activities**

Refreshments are available throughout the weekend for registered participants.

**Good Food:** A potluck lunch will be held on Saturday and Sunday. Participants are asked to bring 2 dishes to pass (one for each day). Friday and Saturday evening, you may want to roast hot dogs at your campsite or go out for a relaxed dinner at one of the nearby restaurants with a group of your new friends.

## Tour Ideas




