

Start your tour at the 1852 William Donaldson log/frame Visitor Center... Browse through the Museum Shop filled with collectibles of days gone by.



From the Oval Office of Neil Besougloff..... The Presidents notes for July 2008

Each year club members receive a roster in the mail listing fellow members' names, addresses, telephone numbers, and the type or types of Model A's they own. But there's more to the roster than a list of contacts.

On the opening page the club board of directors are listed and the club volunteers are listed. The volunteers are our unsung hero's, each taking responsibility for a club function year in and year out without fanfare. This year's volunteer list includes Sue Quam as newsletter editor: Rich Miller as club property keeper; Marilyn Brojanac and Lorraine Schultz as handlers of newsletter distribution; Dave Boucher as keeper of the club's video library; Carl Doro as web master; Art and Sue Blazek as club historians, Ed Schultz as manager of paid newsletter ads, Barb Sonnen as photographer, and Bill Storey as club tool keeper.

They are the folks that keep our club running, but what tools does Bill Storey keep, and what videos does Dave Boucher loan?

Turn to the back pages of the roster, after the last member entry (Michael and Peggy Zimmerman this year), and you'll find out. The list of club tools available to club members runs more than two pages, from a kingpin reamer to a brake-shoe grinding machine. You can even borrow an adjustable tow bar to get your Model A into a garage. For club members, use of the tools require a modest deposit fee and nothing more.

There are two pages of videos available to club members, everything from a video on ignition timing to a pictorial history of our club created by member Dennis Pierce. Again, for a modest deposit fee, they are yours to view.

There's plenty of other information in the back of the roster, including a membership application and listings of past chapter presidents, past member-of-the-year-award recipients, past service-award recipients, and past rookie-of-the-year-award recipients.

There's still more in the roster. Newsletter advertising prices and guidelines are listed; guest fees for the picnic, Christmas party, and other special events are outlined; and there is a page of parade rules and safety guidelines.

If you only read one page in the roster, be sure it's the safety page. The parade rules are common sense: no drinking, don't throw candy or anything else from the car, keep a good-size space between you and the car in front, and don't weave or deviate in any other way from the parade route. The roster says it succinctly: "We are not a clown troupe!"

The safety guidelines focus on properly working brakes, steering, lighting, and horn; installation of safety glass and rear view mirrors, riding on good tires; carrying a charged fire extinguisher, and of course having proper insurance. A cell phone is another worthwhile addition to the list.

So the next time you need to look up a club member in the Wisconsin Chapter Roster, take a few minutes to look over the information in the front and in the back pages. It's time well spent. – Neil Besougloff



- Start promoting your event as early as possible, via the website/newsletter and at club events. Newsletter deadline is the 15th of every month.
- Start a sign up sheet so you know how many people to expect.
- Select a start and finish point.
- Prepare directions and or maps for participants.
- Know that you have a \$300 budget to work within. Use as needed, if needed for your event ie. Snacks, beverages, admissions. Keep receipts, contact chairperson with any questions about spending.
- If you desire, ask for a co-host to help with the event.
- If you have questions contact your outdoor chairperson or any board member. The list of board members is listed in the front cover of the roster & newsletter.
- Verify and confirm events and reservations prior to the event.
- After the event, complete a final meet report (report sheets can be found on the website) and give to outdoor chairperson. Write up a brief overview of the event for the club newsletter and give to editor.
- Over night tours can be more complicated, please contact your chairperson with any questions.
