

July MAFFI Minute


Not everything at the Hickory Corners Model A Museum is about preparing for Model A Days. During the second week of May, a crew consisting of MAFFI Trustees and volunteers worked hard for four days moving and parking Model A's around the Gilmore complex and the local area for multiple photos. During that time, Model A's were carefully removed from the museum building and the "C Barn" to be positioned around the Gilmore campus. Additionally, some of the cars were taken offsite and parked at other country setting locations that included a hops farm, an old church, and a lake. At the end of each day the cars were returned to their homes only to be taken out the following morning to repeat the process.

While the MAFFI Trustees and volunteers were doing this, a photographer, John Lacko, from *Hemmings Motor News*, was taking pictures. By all accounts there were probably more than 2500 pictures taken.

This flurry of activity was for the purpose of helping *Hemmings Motor News* create their Model A calendars for 2024 and 2025. These calendars will be on sale in October of this year and next year. They will be available through *Hemmings Motor News*. This calendar, dedicated to Model A's, is one of 8 different calendars that *Hemmings Motor News* sells each year.

COFFEE & WALLDOGS TOUR SEPTEMBER 17TH, 2023



On September 17th, 2023 Dave & Linda Huenink will host a tour to the Lake Geneva Coffee Roastery in Elkhorn WI and then head to Delavan for a Walldogs scavenger hunt.

Our group will meet at McDonalds, S71 W23460 National Ave, Big Bend, WI between 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. for breakfast (which will be on your own). We will depart at 8:45 a.m. sharp and head west to our destination in Elkhorn -The Lake Geneva Coffee Roastery.

Jeremiah Fox is the owner of the Lake Geneva Coffee Roastery, which is a small commercial roaster and sells coffee to local restaurants, cafes, and grocery stores. Because he is legally blind, he uses his keen sense of smell, hearing and taste to create his roasting profiles using the assistance of talking timers and tactile points on his machines controls so he can adjust the temperature and flow.

After a forty-five-minute tour of the Lake Geneva Coffee Roastery, our group will head to Wilson's Fine Meat's which is very close to the roastery. Make sure you bring a cooler with ice in to put your purchases in. The Wilson Family has been farming since the 1870's. Scott Wilson is the fifthgeneration and established Wilson Farm Meats in 2004. They offer many different cuts of meat as well as a whole or half side of beef or pork which are smoked in their own plant. From there we will head to Delavan for a Wall Dog scavenger hunt



The Walldogs are a group of talented sign and mural artists from all over the world. The Walldog movement began in 1993 when a dozen artists gathered in Allerton, lowa to paint several large historic wall advertisements. The tradition of painting wall advertisements continues today by this modern pack of artists as they paint in the design styles of the past. In June of 2015, the Walldogs gathered in Delavan, Wisconsin and transformed the town with beautiful murals, bringing to life the varied history of Delavan.

When we arrive in Delavan, we will meet at a local park

and from there, each car will head out on the Walldogs search with an answer sheet. Once completed, we will meet again and the answer sheets will be turned in. They will get corrected and prizes will be awarded to those who get the most correct. We will end the day with a bite to eat at Elizabeths Café in Delavan. (Which will be on your own)

The next meeting is July 8th, 2023, at Robert's house.


A motion was made by Dave and seconded by Karen to adjourn the meeting. The motion was put to a vote, and it was carried. The meeting ended at 7:25 p.m.

'A' Trip Back to the July 1978



Way back in 1978 our President was Dennis Pierce. Assisting Dennis was Vice President Bill Hermann, Secretary Dick Lardinois and Treasurer Dan Kane.

July 4th parades included the Brown Deer parade (Ed Schultz chairman) and the Greendale parade (co-

chairs Lunt and DeMaria). While the Brown Deer parade had only 4 cars signed up, beautiful weather saw 15 cars show up the day of the parade – a great turnout and a great time.

July 11 – 16 we participated in the Southgate Mall show. Seventeen cars were displayed at the mall and

volunteers assisted with the information table and to watch over the cars.

July 21 – 23 was the Wisconsin Rapids Reunion

"On the road with Loose Lug Nuts" (National Meet, Virginia Tour with Jerry Manning, 1978)

Our tour left Milwaukee June 21 with three 'A's as planned; my notorious Town Sedan followed by Marlene and Jack Grundman's '28 Tudor and Mike Grundman's '31 Pickup.

The first day was rather uneventful, which is somewhat unusual. The second day included a very interesting tour of the Cord-Auburn-Dusenberg museum, which I highly recommend. From Auburn Indiana our tour took us to Columbus, Ohio and somewhere along the way my exhaust manifold cracked almost completely around. Always travel with your National Roster; with a few phone calls we were able to reach a very helpful man, Tom Fries, who had an exhaust manifold for us and soon we were back on the road.

Onward we travelled, mountain climbing in West Virginia across the Phillippi W. Va. covered bridge, a beautiful drive and a beautiful night

spent on the Virginia Skyline Drive. We spent 2 days in Colonial Williamsburg, a must see of Americana and antiques. The "National Meet" headquarters was the Sheraton National in Arlington, Virginia. It was 4 days of fun, making new friends and renewing acquaintances.

Our return trip took us to the glass factories in West Virginia, and we stopped at the race track while travelling thru Indiana. This month we feature 'Ball Park Beans' (Pat Larson, from WI Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking)

 $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. bacon 1 (20 oz.) can pork and beans

1 small onion ½ c. white sugar ½ lb. hamburger ½ c. brown sugar 2 Tbsp. molasses ¼ c. catsup

½ tsp. dry mustard

1 (16 oz.) can kidney beans, drained 1 (16 oz.) can butter beans, drained

Brown bacon and onion. Add hamburger and continue to brown. Drain off excess fat. Put in bean pot or casserole and add the rest of the ingredients. Mix well and bake for one hour at 350 degrees.
