You can see from the subcommittees the number and variety of activities that were held.

The news media included coverage by the Milwaukee Sentinal (back when there were two Milwaukee papers) on Monday July 7th, and an article with pictures in the Journal also appeared that night along with another photo spread on July 10th in the Journal. Television coverage included Chicago channel 7, Madison channel 15, and Milwaukee channel 6 with John Drilling (channel 6 news) riding in Jerry Manning's Cabriolet, with the camera man in the rumble seat.

There were over 1,115 families registered (161 from Wisconsin) with over 3,000 people in attendance that loved model A's. The staff at the Americana served 1,300 people at the awards banquet in a facility designed for 1,200 and the food was superb!

It sounds like it was an incredible event. I can't imagine that many A's in one place. I'm in 'A' heaven when we go to Sharon and see 200 – 250 cars in one place!

The entertainment at the banquet was hysterical – including Carl Wussow's slide show and a South African visitor, Neil O' Hagen's impression of a Russian Troglidite by the name of Sergei Sonafovitch. A Troglidite is a short person wearing a large black hat, has a face which resembles the chest of a full size man with a mouth looking amazingly like a navel. (you get the picture).

Incredible stories – a Model 'A' was destroyed when the trailer it was riding on let loose and rolled over twice. One 'A' wasn't running well, and to add insult to injury the owner's wife tripped on the running board and broke her leg, spending several days in the hospital. Bill Mitchell from Oregon threw a wheel in the Montana mountains. A group of four model 'A's stopped in to say "hi" on their way to Newfoundland.

The 1986 World Meet – 42 months of planning, 6 days of enjoyment, and years of memories. *Note: if anyone is interested, I have 4 binders on the 1986 World Meet, including 3 binders of just planning for the event. They can be borrowed as long as they are returned.*

May Tour





Model A Day 2014 At Sharon, Wisconsin Is In The History Books

Sunday, June 1, the 18th annual Model A Day at little Sharon, Wisconsin dawned bright and sunny with temperatures later in the low eighties.

The "Official" chapter attendance count was 26 people in 11 A's plus a couple of modern cars. We are not aware of any break downs nor significant glitches with Henry's Ladies. The unofficial tally of total A's in attendance was estimated at 225. This figure was consistent with the participation of the last two years. A peak of over 300 A's was reached about six years ago. Thunder storms were forecast for later in the day which may have deterred some folks from making the trip.

After registering their Fords and receiving a program and a dash plaque, people spent the day looking at all the A's on display. Having homemade pie and ice cream at the Community Center, browsing the sidewalk arts and crafts sales, eating brats and hamburgers. Standing in line at the ever popular ice cream shop for a giant ice cream cone and enjoying the entertainment in the intersection of Baldwin and Plain Streets. Live music was heard all day long from the gazebo in the little veteran's park where the food tent was located.

Chapter members Dave Boucher and Mike Brojanac manned vendor spaces in the flea market/swap meet area along North Street. The swap meet is always a popular feature of the day's activities.

One auto on display from the Chicago area received a lot of attention and it was not a Model A..... It was a 1907 Franklin in absolute pristine condition. (see next page for information and picture)

A few A's started leaving about 1:00 p.m. as the skies were darkening. Most of the return trip was made in light to moderate rain showers. Chapter members didn't return home as a group, most of us left singly or in pairs. Everyone enjoyed the day and its activities.

The Franklin Automobile Company manufactured cars between 1902 and 1934 in Syracuse, New York. The company developed and powered their cars with a very successful air cooled engine.

Throughout the company's life, Franklin was a premium brand and competed with other upscale automobiles of the day. However, it fell victim to the Great Depression along with many other luxury auto manufacturers. Franklin sold about 150,000 cars over the course of their 30 years in business.
