

The park is south of Highway 60 on Jackson Dr. in Jackson. See the map for details. This is the same park we used last year.


There are a lot of fun things to look forward to at this location!

# September Tour

Mark your calendars, **on Sunday September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015** for the fishiest tours ever.

Dave and Linda Huenink will be hosting a tour to the Rushing Water Fisheries in Palmyra Wisconsin.

Departure: We will meet at the McDonald's on Highway 164 and National Ave.

in Big Bend at around 9:00 a.m. for breakfast. At 10:00 a.m. we will take a scenic tour of the country side and Kettle Moraine State Forest as we head to our destination in Palmyra.

At the Rushing Water Fisheries, we will have a guided tour to the 3 trout pond's, learn how the fish eggs are hatched through their various stages of life to when the fish are ready for harvest. The ponds are 400 feet from the parking lot and the path is gravel.

If you desire to go fishing after our tour, you'll need to bring your own pole, bait, cooler and ice. The cost for this is \$9.00 a fish for the first two. If you want to fish for more than two it will be \$8.75 a pound. Rushing Waters will fillet the fish you caught and pack them in ice for you, although you will still need your own cooler and ice for the trip home.

We'll have time after the tour to visit the gift shop where you will be able to buy fresh or frozen fish as well as other food and gift items. (Bring a cooler and ice to keep your fish purchases in). Snacks and refreshments will be provided at this stop.

Then off to our next destination through the country roads to – The Elegant Farmer in Mukwonago - they are known for their excellent apple pies baked in a paper bag. The market has bakery, fresh fruits and vegetables, cheeses, selected meats and other food items. While at the market you may get a glimpse of the East Troy Electric Trolley.




Dave made a motion to adjourn meeting and was seconded by Neil. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 p.m.

The July 1989 newsletter also contained a copy of the proclamation by Milwaukee County Executive David Schultz making Milwaukee the" MODEL-A CAPITAL OF THE WORLD". Well, I guess the record eventually went back to Texas – anyone know what the record is? Sure would be fun to get it back to Milwaukee!

Three new tools have been added to the clubs collection. With the approval of the Board the club purchased a new engine stand which has been modified for use with a model 'A' engine only. Also added by way of a donation was a frame spreader to facilitate the mounting of the motor between the frame rails. The third item added to the collection is a 9/16" eight point socket with a half inch drive to fit the fastners of the engine main bearing caps.

The July 1989 newsletter also contained a 'Ladies Page' written by Burdella Miller which contained recipes for 'Cracker Bar', 'Puppy Chow', and 'Punch'. Burdella also emphasized the importance of women taking a "Me Day", time spent once a month for doing those things you keep promising yourself you'll do….."if only I had the time".

The following appeared in the July 1989 newsletter. It was taken from the April issue of Road & Track. I have included only the last few paragraphs:

"Richard Bach once said that old airplanes last forever, unless crashed and have a longer life span than human beings. The good ones – the simple, honest designs can be rebuilt over and over again.

The model 'A' I think, is like those old planes. Given reasonable care, it should outlive all of us, and if the supply of gasoline holds out, it could be chugging across the country 58 years from now. Which is more than you can say for most of the cars that passed us on the highway. When Henry Ford built the model 'A', he ignored his accountants' pleas to use lower grade materials and make the car cheaper. He told them that if you make a high quality product, the public would recognize the quality, buy more cars, and the profits would take care of themselves. Ford was a visionary who wanted to build something permanent, a machine with lasting worth and value.

After all these years, the vision is still a good one and the model 'A' remains a fine car. Like a Woody Guthrie song or a good guitar, it doesn't get old, it just gets better."
