



Reminiscing with the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1957 - No information for June. However, a letter written in 1957 by Demo Staver, President of Model A Ford Club, reads in part: "1. Our constitution was drawn up by nine elected members who have the needed initiative and willingness to serve. These men subsequently became the Board of Directors. 2. Our club is run by its total membership, not by the Board or by any one or two individuals. All officers are elected by the membership and will change yearly."

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1962 - On June 17th, a few members gathered for a short tour to Delafield, to visit the fire watch tower, which provides an excellent view for miles around. However, due to road construction on both Highways 18 and 30, the roads to the tower were completely blocked.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1967 - Menomonee Falls contacted the club about furnishing 10 to 15 cars for the Diamond Jubilee Parade.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1972 - Ten Model A's and nine V-8's were part of the annual Southridge All-Ford Show.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1977 - The spring tour chaired by the Boucher's went to North Lake to ride the Kettle Moraine Railroad.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS GO,1982 - The technical seminar for June was a tour of the Miller Brewery. After the tour, arrangements were made to sample the Miller products.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1987 - The Wisconsin Chapter acquired for the seventh year the Wisconsin State Fair race track for one of the largest car shows in Wisconsin. The show this year was for one day only, to make it easier and more fun to put this large show on.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1992 - Cedarburg contacted the club about cars for display at their annual Strawberry Days Festival.

TEN YEARS AGO, 1997 - A micro-brewery tour stopped at the Harbor City Brewing Company and a smoked fish house in Port Washington.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2002 - Secretary Rich Miller reported the club has 387 members, and the members who joined the Wisconsin Chapter from January, 1998 to June, 2002 comprised 25% of the membership.

This was followed by Al Downs presentation on using LeBaron Bonney kit to upholster your seats. Al's presentation showed kit components and went on to show how to install it.






