





While at the dance someone tried to steal the spare tire but was caught and they put the tire in the back seat because the log nuts were lost. The tire in the back compounded the collision impact. On the way home they stopped at the Meeker Hill gas station which is on Highway 175 in Germantown. Helen asked Norman to let her drive and when they reached the bridge on 175 near Lannon Road they were being met by a car going down the middle of the road on the

They were nearly stopped when the other car crashed into them. Helen had a broken leg and other injuries and was in the hospital for three months. Norman had a broken leg, head injuries from going through the windshield, and other injuries, he spent nine months in the hospital. They had not been dating steady but did so after both were finally out of the hospital. They were engaged in December 1940, married on June 11, 1941 and had eight children. The last house Norman built before retiring was for Jo Lene and I, in Menomonee Falls in 1978. Helen celebrated her 89th birthday on April 6th this year.

There are many great tours scheduled for the rest of the touring season. I look forward to seeing many of you on a tour this season. That includes Jerry Flynn who is in rehab at Linden Grove in Menomonee Falls.






Ever Wonder


GENERATOR vs ALTERNATOR

WHY ONE AND NOT THE OTHER?


This is an issue of *Reliability* for those that want to tour with their Model A. The generator practically disappeared by the mid 1960's, being replaced with the alternator.

The generator is not a regulating device. The 3rd brush must be manually set to the amount of voltage needed to maintain a charge to the battery. A 6 volt battery requires 7.2 volts charging voltage. This results in about 10 amp (charging) reading on the ammeter. When the headlights are turned on, the ammeter reading will drop to near "0" or slight discharge. This does not allow for any charging voltage to the battery. When long drives take place with the head lights on, the generator would need to be readjusted to compensate for amperage used by the headlights.

In 1939 a voltage regulator box was attached to the firewall that automatically regulated the output voltage of the generator according to usage. This eliminated the need to manually readjust the generator every time another electrical device was turned on, primarily the head lights.

The Model A generator requires a cut-out (relay), as did all generators prior to the regulator, to prevent the battery from being discharged back through the generator when the engine is not running. The cut-out is a set of relay contacts that close as soon as the generator produces 2 volts or more. The output of the generator then passes through the closed contacts of the cut-out relay to the electrical circuits and battery. When the engine is turned off, the relay contacts open, preventing the battery from discharging back through the generator to ground. The cut-out relay contacts have a tendency to fail, either the contacts do not close or the contacts stick in the closed position, allowing the battery to discharge unsuspectingly.

By 1965, Ford had begun installing the alternator, a self regulating device. The Alternator is also a solid state device, eliminating the mechanical relay contacts. The GM Delco Alternator is a single wire, self energized alternator that is best suited for the Model A. Most Model A parts suppliers carry this alternator. It is available in both 6 and 12 volt output.

For the touring Model A, you can eliminate the troublesome cut-out and non-regulated output of the generator, and tour with reliability by installing an alternator.

you drive a roadster pick-up without a top. Or, Dave Rozman or Mike Yokofich could answer the question, "How wet do you get riding A Harley in the rain?"



At the end of our seminar, Al and Tony passed out the current edition of Wisconsin Chapter Inc., MAFCA booklet on Road Repairs along with the Ford Standards of Adjustment card. This booklet and card can easily be kept in the Model A for quick reminders on what to check for when that Model A doesn't run like a Model A should.

Thank you to all who came this past year and made our seminars work. We also appreciate Al and Tony giving us the opportunity to use Mail Truck Model A Ford facilities for our seminars.
