The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by Mike Quam. Nothing to report

THE REARVIEW MIRROR.....

We survived the May 2011 tour to the airplane factory.

It was a chilly, gloomy and windy Sunday as we descended on the American Champion Aircraft Corp. (ACA) just outside Rochester, Wisconsin.

47 hardy souls in 14 Model A's and eleven "modern" cars were welcomed by ACA's Chief Test Pilot, Mr. Dale Gauger.

The Champion lineage goes way back to the 1920's and the Bellanca Aircraft Company. Originally, Charles Lindbergh and his St. Louis fi-



nancial backers wanted to buy a Bellanca for Lindbergh's attempt to fly the Atlantic solo. However, Bellanca would only sell them a plane with the condition that Bellanca provide the pilot. Of course Lindbergh wanted to be the one to make the flight so the deal fell through. He then went to San Diego, California and the Ryan Aircraft Company, struck a deal and the result was the famous Spirit of St. Louis.

Of the half dozen different models available today; four are in Standard category and two are fully airbatic aircraft. One of the airbatic models is the Citabria...... Now, I wonder what the origin of that name would be?

Their basic model starts at about \$110,000. The top airbatic Super Decathlon starts at \$168,000. After adding on numerous options, the price can go upwards of \$200,000 plus. Options include engine horse power size, instruments, avionics (radios, etc.) and other accessories. ACA currently employs about 50 people and it takes about six weeks to complete an order as, basically, they are hand built.

Two hours after we started, Dale had walked us through the entire process of what is involved in the construction of the classic line of Champion aircraft. We presented him with a Certificate of Appreciation from the chapter, had a little photo op and then headed for Callanan's Pub in West Allis for some liquid refreshments and snacks. Everyone really went for the home made kettle chips..... a house specialty.

We had a great time. If you didn't join with us..... You missed out on a really neat tour.

By the way..... The Citabria model name is airbatic spelled backwards.
