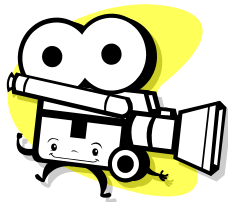

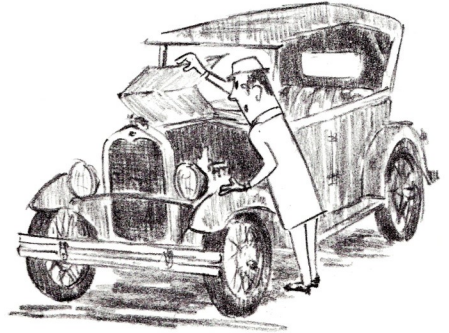

Prez Notes for March 2008



There was a bit of excitement among local antique car owners a few weeks ago. Representatives from Universal Studios were in town for a casting call for extras in a new movie about the infamous Depression-era bank robber John Dillinger.

The casting call wasn't for people – it was for cars.

Universal is expected to begin filming “Public Enemies” starting this spring at several sites in Wisconsin and also in Chicago. The movie production company announced it was looking for cars built between the years 1930 and 1935 for use in background street scenes in the movie.

The film stars Johnny Depp (he's the guy in the recent “Pirates of the Caribbean” movies). According to advance write-ups of the film, the drama is set in the mid-1930s and centers on attempts by J. Edgar Hoover and the FBI to stop notorious criminals such as Dillinger, Baby Face Nelson, and Pretty Boy Floyd. The script reportedly is based on a book titled “Public Enemies: America's Greatest Crime Wave and the Birth of the FBI, 1933-34,” written by Bryan Burrough in 2004.

Depp will play Dillinger, among the most well-known gangsters of the era.

A fellow named Howard Bachrach, who has the title of “Picture Car Captain” for the movie company, was at Miller Park back on Feb. 4 as car owners stopped by to drop off photos and other information about their cars. Not surprisingly, many of the photos were of Model A's. Bachrach would have preferred to see the actual cars, but our snowy winter weather curtailed that.

Similar casting calls for cars for the film also were held in Madison and Oshkosh.

At the Milwaukee casting call, Bachrach told me and fellow Wisconsin Chapter members Bob and Sandi Davison that the film company wanted to have three groups of cars in those three cities to avoid, for example, a Milwaukee car owner being asked to have his car in Oshkosh. He added that all of the principle cars in the film – those that would be used with the actors or might be crashed – had already been acquired.

Bachrach promised his group would contact all who offered their cars for use in the movie. In mid February he sent out an email saying that there had been a huge response to the casting call, and that it was taking longer than expected for the film's director to review all of the photos of cars submitted.

Will any cars owned by Wisconsin Chapter members be part of the movie? None of us know as of this writing, so stay tuned!

Roger suggested having beer at the picnic, issues with insurance coverage were discussed. Neil will talk with our insurance company to see about a one day policy if beer is provided.

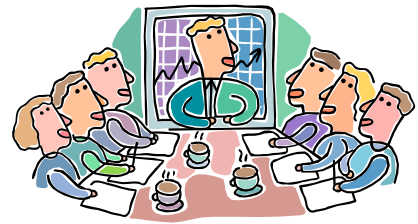

45 YEARS AGO, 1963 - A costume ball was held. Wally and Jan Klager brought a pair of TV characters to life with costumes; they were dressed as the Flintstones, Fred and Wilma.



40 YEARS AGO, 1968 - The Model A Club dance at Kuglitsch's Arcade was a traditional success. Testimony to this can be taken from the consumption of 6 half-barrels of beer and 265 people in attendance.

35 YEARS AGO - 1973 - Approximately 350 attended the club dance, held March 3rd. This was about 100 more than attended the year before. Net profits were \$165.00.

30 YEARS AGO, 1978 - Mike Kultgen was in Fond du Lac helping to finalize plans for the Rapids Reunion. The annual dance was a great success; 385 people attended. Marilyn Brojanac had her recipes for turtles and Hello, Dolly bars.

25 YEARS AGO, 1983 - On the Ladies' Page of the newsletter, Diane Smith gave a page and a half of hot tips for microwave users.

20 YEARS AGO, 1988 - The Ice Cream Social was enjoyed by all, while listening to a Dixieland band.

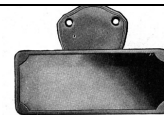

Dick Moeller, retired owner of Remy Battery, gave a "2-1/2 hour" talk on batteries. You may wonder what could be said about batteries for 2-1/2 hours, but let me tell you that Dick was an excellent, interesting speaker and had so much knowledge that we could have listened even longer. He held everyone's attention and invoked many questions.

After handing out detailed informational sheets to each attendee, Dick explained the many important facets of batteries while giving us many useful tips along the way. Topics he covered were how a lead/acid and other type batteries work, how to accurately test and maintain batteries, use of a hydrometer, charging batteries and types of chargers. He also discussed correctly storing your battery outside the car or safely keeping it in the car during the cold season.

At the end of the seminar, Dick had a 6-volt "Battery Tender" as a door prize that was won by Jeff Bezotte. I'm sure everyone learned something new and enjoyed a fun evening with friends, food and facts!
