THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1980 - A men's seminar took place at Avenue Brake Shop on how to rebuild transmissions. The Wausau Antique Auto Club provided a slide show at the indoor meet.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1985 - The month started with an ice cream social at the indoor meet. We had a seminar at Avenue Brake Shop on the history of car frames through today's unit body construction.

equipment was the topic of the seminar presented by P.P.G. Parts Hut from Waukesha.


FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1995 - A seminar on tune-ups was held at Avenue Brake Shop in preparation for the upcoming touring season.

Wisconsin Chapter, Inc. MAFCA Technical Seminar Doing A Model "A" Valve Job Thursday, January 21, 2009 @ 7:00 p.m.

Tony showed us how we can do a valve job with just the hand tools we have available in our Wisconsin Chapter club tool crib. Tony and Al presented a great hands demonstration at our seminar at Mail Truck Model A Ford Parts Company. The Valve Grinding went well at our January Seminar.

See the neat well done hand grinding job on the valve seats by our Model A volunteers? Notice "#8" on a valve? Each valve is fitted individually. Notice also how the block is sealed off so that shavings will not fall in any ports. This makes it easier to clean out the block.

IT'S HISTORY

The Banquet of 2010 is now in the history books. We had 110 members in attendance.
