Reminiscing with the Historian

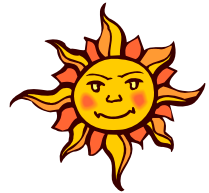

THE BIRTH AND HISTORY OF SERVICE STATIONS

The history of the automobile is the history of service stations. Although most people were doubtful as to the necessity for horseless carriages, improvements increased their popularity. Introduced into the U.S. in 1895, by 1913 registration exceeded one million. Simultaneous with this growth the gasoline end of the petroleum industry came into prominence. And the adequate supply of cheap gasoline made this growth possible. Therefore it is only natural that the idea for filling stations should have developed. Horses had stables; cars had filling stations. The first filling station in the U.S. is credited to Standard Oil Company in Seattle, Washington in 1907. The gas dispenser consisted of a hot water boiler and a faucet at a bulk plant. At this early time filling stations were merely convenient points for a motorist to fill up with gas and oil. Soon after, though, other services were added. First came free air and water. Only those who have used the back-breaking hand pumps can appreciate what a convenience this service was to the motorist. By 1921 the improvements in auto engines and better highways brought extended car trips. Service stations saw the need for rest rooms and drinking fountains. By the late 1920's the motorist wished to have the responsibility for lubrication in the hands of a person who understood machinery. He also began to appreciate when the serviceman would wash windows while the car was filled up. By the 1930's service stations routinely stocked tires, headlight bulbs and batteries. Today everything essential to the care of your automobile can be found at your neighborhood service station.

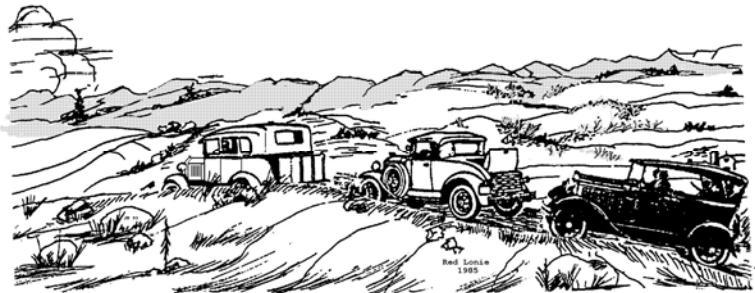

What to stash under your seat on a tour

Ever wonder what some Model A owners carry in their cars while on tour? Here's a list of 35 parts that was published in the Winter 2007 issue of the Model A Times magazine (modelatimes.net). Our club subscribes to the Model A Times magazine, which features stories about repair and restoration techniques and products. Current and back issues are available to browse at our technical meets.

Item no. 36 wasn't on the original published list, but is a smart addition! – Neil Besougloff, technical editor.

22. Distributor assembly with cap body and rotor (timed for your car)
23. Exhaust manifold gasket
24. Gas gauge gasket set
25. Radiator cap
26. Gas cap
27. Electrical swage terminals (assorted)
28. Windshield wiper blade
29. Distributor internal wire
30. Fuel strainer bowl gasket and screen
31. Lug nut and washers (5 each)
32. Radiator hose and clamp set
33. Starter switch
34. Set of fuel line and fittings
35. Clamp (muffler to exhaust manifold)
36. Cell phone with a fully charged battery

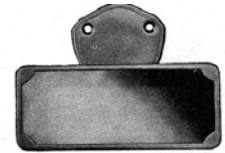

The winter technical meet season will continue Thursday, March 15 with a session on distributor repair.

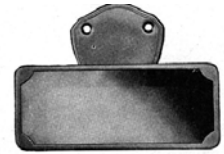

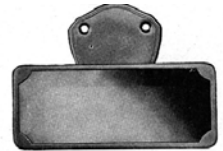

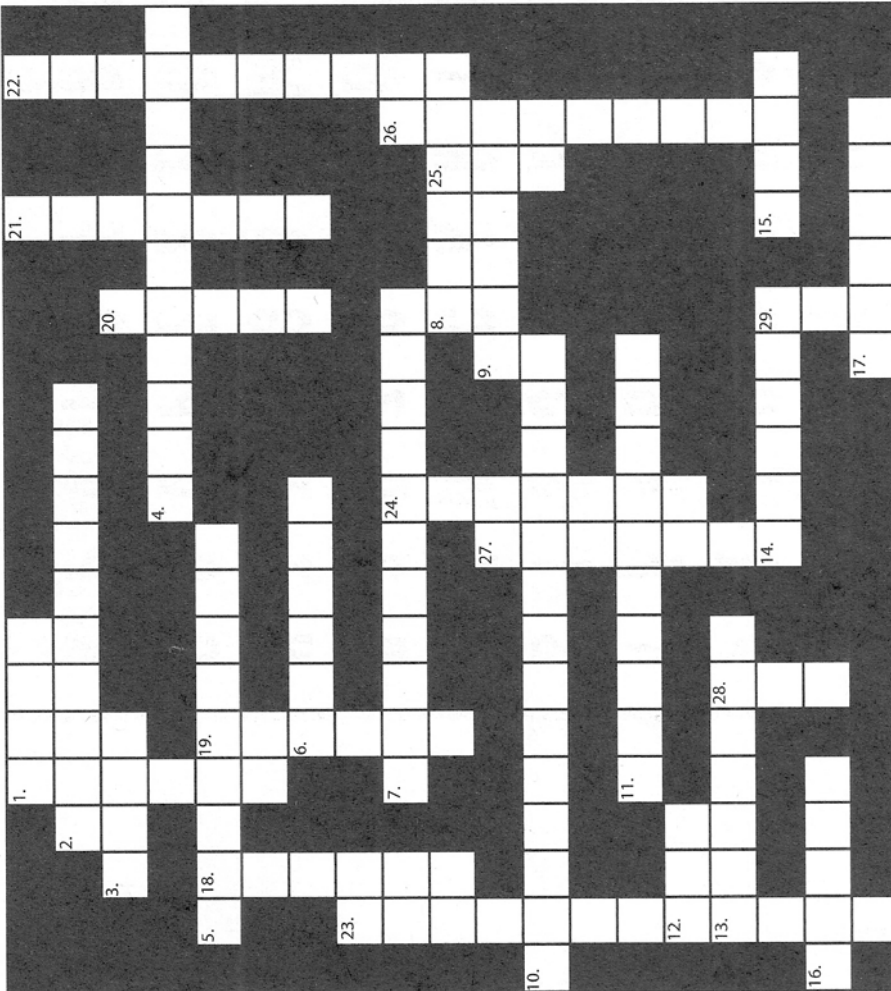
