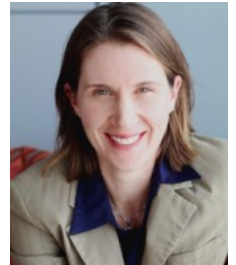

## **WE ARE MOVING IN NOVEMBER**



The Wisconsin Chapter Model A Ford Club of America will have new “digs” as of this fall. The corner of 92<sup>nd</sup> and Greenfield has been sold and our contract has not been renewed. At the January meeting a small committee was formed to look into a new home for our fall and winter meetings. Two church basement halls were reviewed and the one that best fits our needs is Greenfield Park Lutheran Church.

The church is located at 1236 S 115<sup>th</sup> Street, two miles west of our current location on the corner of 115<sup>th</sup> and Madison. The basement is set up, as this hall is, with rectangle tables and chairs. We can use the fully-equipped kitchen that is off to the side at the far end. 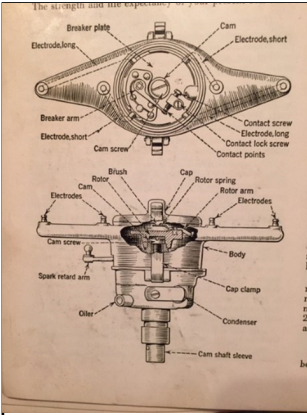

After a short shop tour, we plan to cover basic Model A distributor rebuilding and trouble shooting. We will also demonstrate a simple way to set up an extra distributor ready to drop in the engine ready to run with no retiming.

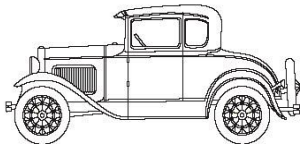

# Eagle River Weekend Get-A-Way

New Updated Info-Can't miss event!!

Thursday, July 30 - Monday, August 3, 2020

This is truly a "can't miss" event. The ride will be long but so worth it. We are leaving on Thursday and heading back Monday to avoid the heavier weekend traffic and to allow a more leisurely route.

We have 15 confirmed rooms held at the **Eagle River Inn**, Eagle River, Wisconsin. It is a beautiful setting on Watersmeet Lake where the Eagle River and the Wisconsin River join on their journey to the Mississippi River. The complex is located on Hwy.70 West, just about a mile from the City of Eagle River. The parking lot is secure and away from other locations that would have had lots of traffic. Breakfast is included. Some items include: hot waffles, breakfast sandwiches, hard boiled eggs, oatmeal, Danish, cereal, coffee and other items.

Room Rates on the parking lot side, 2 queen beds, fridge and micro is on special for us at \$107.10 and a lakeside room, with patio doors opening directly to the water complex are \$125.10. None of the other hotels have settings like this one and others are in more crowded areas with much more vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Hotel registration can be made by each family by calling the **Eagle River Inn: 715-479-2000**. They will need to identify themselves as part of the group from the Wisconsin Chapter, Model A Ford Club to get those special rates. I suggest that you make initial contact with the Eagle River Inn not much later than January as summer reservations will be increasing after that time. Early is always better than late!

Details are still being finalized for the weekend, but so far we will plan a Friday late-morning Pirates Hideaway cruise (Pirate attire is encouraged) and a Fish fry at Chef Rene's award winning restaurant at the Eagle River Inn (all you can eat for \$14) and they have a bar lounge adjacent to the restaurant.

Saturday is our weekend headliner event - Three Lakes Petroleum Museum Car Show: Arrive by 9:00 a.m. or before. The show is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. with awards following. The museum is free and open all day. Food is available on the grounds and each car registered early will receive a coupon for 1 sandwich (hamburger, cheeseburger, bratwurst or hotdog, chips, soda and popcorn. Over 250 vehicles will be on display.

The Three Lakes Winery is only 2 miles away from the car show and the wine selection is outstanding along with a related "wine related" gift shop.

Saturday night event will be movie and pizza night. We will be showing Public Enemies. It was filmed at Little Bohemia just a few years ago and starred Johnny Depp. It is accurate, exciting and will be an opportunity to prime us for our dinner at Little Bohemia the following night.

Sunday the group will depart the hotel at 1:30 for a drive through the beautiful forests in the area. We will stop at the Dillinger Museum for a tour and then enjoy dinner at Little Bohemia at 5:00 p.m. Since it has never been restored after the FBI and Dillinger gun battle, our cars will be a highlight for photographs in front of the main building. We will return the hotel before dark.

# MAFCA Wisconsin Chapter General Meeting Minutes

## February 9th, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 1:43 p.m.

**President – Kate** - The Board received the newsletters from the reciprocating clubs and a thank you note from Finally Home for the clubs donation of \$500.00. A flier regarding the Iola Car Show was available to the membership.

**Vice President – Mark** – There are no new members this month.

**Secretary – Dave** – A motion was made by Sue Quam and seconded by Dave Boucher to accept the January 12th, meeting minutes as written. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. 151 members have renewed their membership and 30 have not for 2020.

**Treasurer – Steve** – A report of the revenue and expenses from last month was given. A motion was made by Paul Piotrowski and seconded by Donna Boucher to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. No bills were turned in. Paul Piotrowski and Jan Olsen are doing the treasurer's audit of the 2019 financial records. Some income was turned in today for the swap meet. No other income was turned in.

**Outdoor – Jeana** – Hosts are needed for several of the 2020 outdoor touring season events. Many events already have hosts and Jeana encouraged the membership to sign up for an event. Jan Olsen has information in Wheeling the A regarding the Memorial Day Overnighter. The event is to the LaCrosse area with several tours planned in the area. Mark Ackermann is doing the annual picnic at the same park in Sussex as last year and everything is in place for the event. More information will be coming in Wheeling the A. Deb Lewis mentioned the hotel in Eagle River for the Eagle River Tour is asking for people to make their reservations so they can free up any rooms that are not being used. Jeana asked those giving tours to get their articles in Wheeling the A in a timely fashion and well as the follow up articles. She would also like a written report on each event using the forms on the club website.

**Indoor – Vicki** – Hosts are needed for the 2020 /2021 indoor season. A possible new location has been found for the club's monthly indoor meetings. The location is Greenfield Park Lutheran Church, 1236 S. 115th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 53214. The cost is \$50.00 month. A brief discussion was held regarding on-line club dues renewal. The Board is looking for ideas from the membership to celebrate the clubs 65th anniversary as well as ideas for a spring donation.

A motion was made by Paul Piotrowski and seconded by Dave Boucher to adjourn the meeting. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. The meeting was adjourned at 2:23 p.m.

## Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon

### Check Your Oil Filler Pipe and Cap



Many Model A owners experience excessive oil leaks when driving their car, often out the rear main seal. One simple thing that can cause this is a restriction in the oil filler pipe. Take the cap off and look down the pipe with a good light. You should only see a series of little metal baffles, half-moon in shape, inside the filler pipe. If you find where someone has covered the pipe with a sock, or stuffed a piece of cloth down in the filler pipe to stop oil from coming out the filler when driving, this will put pressure inside the crankcase and force oil out the rear main seal while you drive. Easy to fix: get that stuff out of there!

While you have it off, also inspect the inside of the oil filler cap. It, too, needs to be clear inside. No pieces of steel wool, pot scrubber, or old sock in the cap! Look for evidence of someone accidentally pushing the oil filler cap on too far. When you do, you bend the little tabs inside the cap and mash it all the way down on the pipe. This blocks the engine's ability to vent the crankcase, builds up pressure, and causes a bad leak out the rear main seal.

I hope this little tip helps you stop that oil leak while driving. Have a Model A Day!

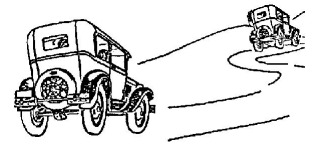

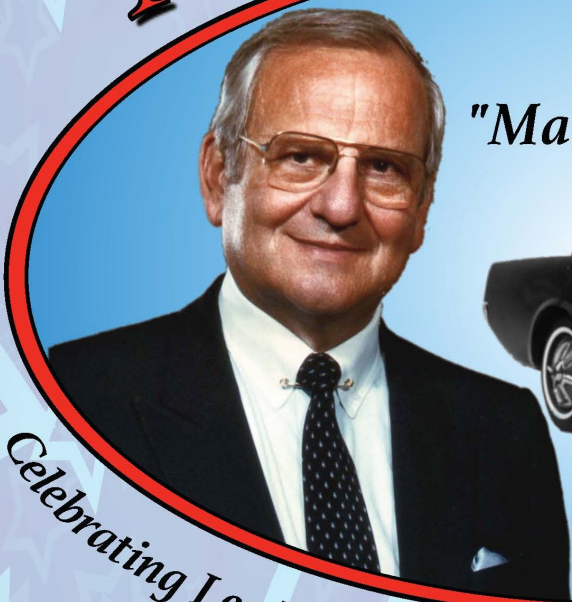

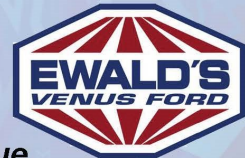
