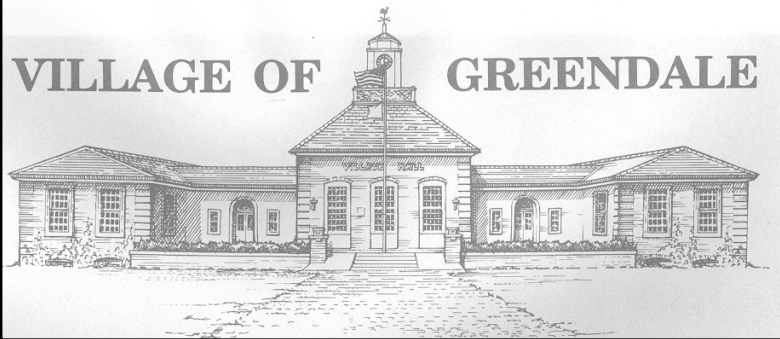

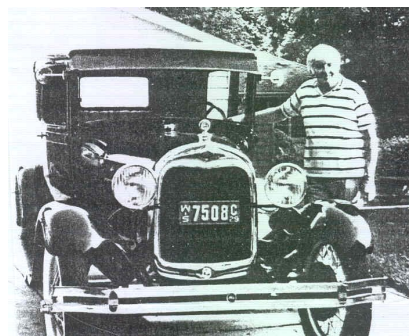

Reminiscing with the Historian

FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1957 – A meeting was held to get signatures on the state of Wisconsin antique license petition, We were asking for a reduced rate, permanent license plate for cars 25 years or older.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1962 – A hearty welcome was given to new members Larry Koser, Larry Cooper, Bruce Ketchpaw, Carroll Linday, Ken Klann and Gen Wedward.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1967 – No information for May

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1972 – It was reported that our average member owns 1.5 Model A's; one is restored and 0.5 is an unrestored vehicle. In a total of 112 responses, 166 Model A's were listed (with an individual range of 0 to 5 Model A's in a garage). Fifty-six Model A's were unrestored and the remaining 110 were restored and/or in driving condition.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1977 – The May economy run was hosted by Wes and Brian Campbell. The winners were: 1st place, Art Peterson, 2nd place, Mary Engel, and tied for 3rd place, Beau Lowerr and Ed Schultz.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1982 – The second annual "Go Fly a Kite Tour" was held in May at the VFW Post on the corner of Hillendale Rd. and Hwy. 24. The hosts were the Bouchers and the Mazurkiewiczs.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1987 – Twenty-one Model A's, a '37 Ford coupe, a '56 T-Bird, and various other modern irons carried fifty-seven adults, six-month old Michael Lauwasser and four-month old Christopher Larson to the Wagon Trail Resort in Door County.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1992 – Ed and Lorraine Schultz and Jim and Marlene Stegner hosted a fun-filled crazy mixed-up bowling party at Krueger's Lanes. No skill was required. \$10.00 included bowling, shoes, pizza, beer, and soda.

TEN YEARS AGO, 1997 – Model A's were on display at the Newberry Elegance Day in Milwaukee.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2002 – The club toured the Wisconsin Automotive Museum in Hartford, Wisconsin. Over 90 different automobiles were on display, including the Kissel, which was custom-built in Hartford from 1906 to 1931.

Again, “A” Thank You to Wisconsin Chapter members who took time from their busy lives to volunteer their time and make this Swap Meet “A” winner.

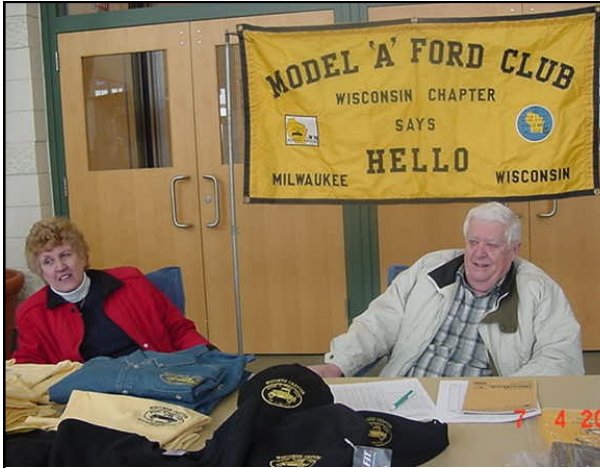

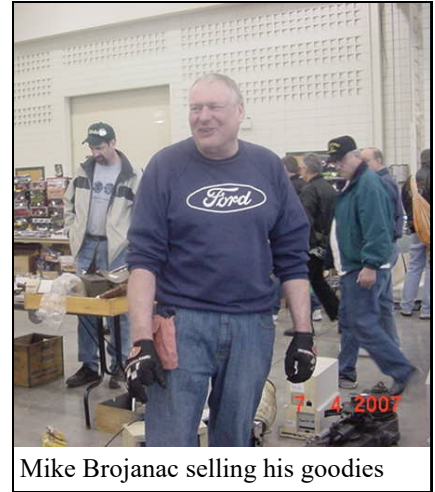

Thank you to hosts: Wally & Sally Kaufman and Pat & Stan Larson for a beautiful afternoon.

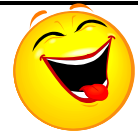

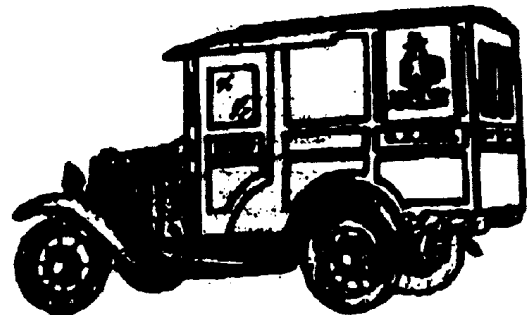

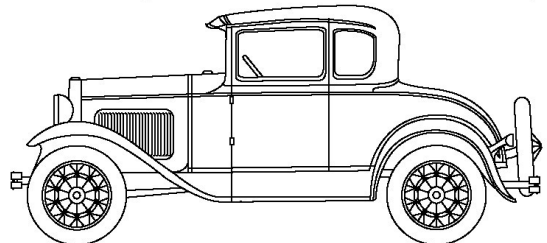
