




Memorial Day Parade



Where are we going? To Kenosha, Wisconsin of course.


What is the occasion? It's the July Tour, Sunday, July 21, 2013.

Mike, the Public Relations Manager of the World Class *Iola Old Car Show & Swap Meet* was responsible for Iola to host the first unveiling by the Ford Motor Company of Henry's 20,000,000 car, a restored 1931 Model "A". What a great job by the world class staff at Iola.

Tony Sillman, our web master has a great web page for the Wisconsin Chapter and is currently doing the web page for the Iola Old Car Show. He is doing a wonderful job. Please visit both sites. Tony, with his laptop computer and digital camera, made a tough job look easy. You will enjoy both sites.

Tech meet season wraps up with a look at transmissions

Model A transmissions were the topic of the final technical meet of the 2012-13 season. Tony Baudo of Mail Truck Model A Parts led the session. Tony explained some of the damage he discovers when rebuilding transmissions, the causes of the damage, and how repairs are made.

All of our Model A cars and light trucks were originally built with three-speed manual transmissions. Model AA heavier trucks had fourspeed transmissions but the extra gear was used as an ultra-low speed gear to get the truck moving on hills and in other demanding situations. According to Ford service bulletins, there were some changes to the transmission design between 1929 and 1931 – such as alterations to the case and bearing retainers – but the basic design of the transmission was consistent throughout Model A production.

Typical gear ratios on our three-speed transmissions are low: 8.75 to 1; second: 6.9 to 1, and high: 1 to 1.

In general, Tony explained that most of the damage is from wear and tear, and symptoms include the transmission "popping" out of gear while driving or an inability to shift into one or more gears.

Transmission trouble spots include worn and sometimes broken teeth on the gears and also worn bearings in various locations in the transmission that cause adjacent parts to wear improperly.

There is no way to make a quick fix on a transmission, it must be taken apart and all gears, bearings, and other components must be examined for wear and replaced when necessary. Replacements for transmission parts subject to wear can be purchased, and some parts retailers even sell complete new or rebuilt transmissions. According to Les Andrews in his book "Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook, Vol. 1," the transmission should be removed from the car before beginning repairs. It can be removed when the engine has been removed, or, if the engine is not being removed, the transmission can be removed from behind by removing the rear-end assembly first. Les, who is a noted Model A repair expert, explains in his book that it is actually more work to remove the transmission from a car than it is to repair a transmission.

Tony pointed out that many of the transmissions he sees in his shop have suffered from poor lubrication.

Our Model A transmissions are designed to hold 1½ pints of "600w" gear oil. To check your lubricant level you'll need to crawl under your car and remove the fill plug, or you may be able to access the plug from above with your car's floorboards removed. Put your pinkie finger in the plug opening and feel for the level of the gear oil; add more gear oil if you cannot find the level with your finger tip.

Lastly, Tony suggested that we not drive with our right-hand resting on the shift lever. Even that small amount of pressure over time will cause unwanted wear to transmission gears.

Our monthly winter technical seminars will start up again in mid-October at Model A Mail Truck Parts in Oak Creek. If you have an idea for a seminar please call technical chairman Neil Besougloff at 262-408-1479. Thanks once again to Tony Baudo for allowing us to meet at his shop this past season. – *Neil Besougloff, technical chairman*


Left: Tony Baudo, of Mail Truck Model A Parts, describes the inner workings of Model A transmissions.

The The blouse crushes at the waistline and forms a close-fitting peplum. The sleeves have deep cuffs that reach to the elbows. The skirt has a flared panel in front.
