



Old Business – Nothing to report.


New Business – The current taxes and necessary annual paperwork have been filed.

'A' Look Back at Henry's Mother



When I think of the month of May, I think of Mother's Day. That thought had me thinking about Henry Ford's mother. Who was she? What was her name? What was her life like? How did she influence her famous son?

There is not a lot of history that I was able to find about Henry's mother. Her name is Mary Litogot O'Hern, born in 1839. She was taken-in at the age of 3 and raised by Patrick and Margaret (Stevens) O'Hern after the untimely death of her father. There is no mention of her biological mother, who (my thought) may have died in childbirth.

Patrick O'Hern, like the Fords, had emigrated from County Cork, Ireland, to the Detroit area, and married Margaret Stevens on July 15, 1834. Beginning in 1841 they purchased land in Dearborn.

William Ford, Henry's father, a hard working industrious man, who not only worked the family farm and on the Michigan Central Railroad, also helped at the O'Hern's ninety-one acre farm. Through his hard work he was able to purchase half of his father's farm for \$600.



While at the O'Hern home, William Ford met Mary Litogot O'Hern, their foster daughter, an attractive, dark-eyed young woman. Romance followed and they married on April 25th 1861. The newlyweds moved in with the O'Hern's while William planned and constructed a new house to be occupied by both families. The new home was a seven-room home, impressive for its day. Later four more rooms would be added to accommodate their large family. Together they had 8 children. Henry was the eldest, born July 30th, 1863, two years after Mary's first baby died. Her live births were every two years ending in 1876 when she died in child birth at only 37. The family belonged to the Christ Episcopal Church of Dearborn.

The website said that Mary Ford, despite the burdens of a growing family (one child every 2 years) found time to instill in Henry her own sense of cleanliness and order. She taught him to read putting Henry ahead of other schoolmates when he started school. The same year that Henry realized he had the instincts of an engineer, the Ford family was shocked by Mary's death on March 29, 1876. Her quiet, forcefulness and strong moral influence had been the guiding spirit for the family. Henry Ford felt that "the house was now a watch without a mainspring." That analogy came from Henry's curiosity and hobby of watch repairing. Henry was 13 when she passed. Mary Litogot O'Hern Ford is buried in Ford Cemetery, in Detroit.


It was nice getting back to our outdoor events again. Overall it seemed everyone had a great time. Thank you to those participating!!
