





This picture then appeared in the January-February-issue of the Restorer with the caption "youngest member at December Christmas Party".


That car was his present from Santa and you can barely make out the cookie being crumbled in his hand.

# Add a multimeter or test lamp to your tool kit

Most of us carry mechanical tools in our Model A's – screwdrivers, wrenches, and pliers – and we should carry electrical tools, too. Chief among them are a multimeter or a test lamp.

When your electrical system is malfunctioning, both tools can help you discover where the problem is.

A multimeter is an electrical measuring instrument. A multimeter can be used as an ammeter to measure current, a voltmeter to measure voltage, and an ohmmeter to measure resistance. A test lamp, which is simply a light bulb with two wires, can be used to check for power in a circuit.

Multimeters come in two styles: digital and analog. The photo shows an inexpensive analog meter, which has a series of markings and a needle in its window. A digital multimeter uses a digital numeric readout instead, and is generally more precise. Either will work for troubleshooting Model A's.

Both multimeters and test lamps have two wires. On a multimeter, these are called probes. You can extend the reach of these wires easily with alligatorclip extension wires. It's a good idea to carry several alligator-clip extension wires in your tool box along with your meter or test lamp.

Multimeters also contain small batteries to allow them to perform their functions. The meter in the photo uses a single AA battery.

How would you use a multimeter or test lamp on your Model A?

Let's say one of your tail lamps is out. Your first instinct is to change the bulb. But if a replacement bulb doesn't illuminate, then there likely is something wrong with the tail lamp's electrical circuit. To check the circuit, set your multimeter to measure Direct Current (DC) voltage. Pick a DC voltage range that is close to the 6 or 12 volts in your car. My car has a 6-volt system, so I simply use the DC range on my analog meter that is designed to test 9-volt batteries. If my needle moves 2/3 across the dial, I know it is registering 6 volts.

To check the tail-lamp circuit, turn on your headlight switch and touch the black multimeter wire probe to the center contact point of the tail-lamp socket and the red to the outside metal of socket. (The red/black alignment presumes your car is still positive ground, as Henry built them.)

If there is electricity flowing through the circuit, the multimeter will display voltage. If you do not get a reading, your electrical circuit is broken somewhere further upstream from the tail lamp socket. You can make this same troubleshooting check with a test light of either 6 or 12 volts, depending on your car. If the test light illuminates, there is electricity flowing to the tail-lamp socket.

If you suspect that there is a break in one of the wires going to the tail lamp socket, you can check the integrity of that wire using the ohmmeter function of your multimeter. Basically, you are checking to see if electricity passes from one end of the wire to the other. This test could determine if there is a



break in the wire that is hidden by the wire's insulation.

For this test, set your multimeter to the ohm function (it is the "horseshoe" shaped icon on the meter). Touch the two probes together briefly and watch what happens to the meter's dial. Then touch one probe to each end of the wire that you suspect is broken. If the wire is good, you will get the same response from the meter as you did when you touched the two probes together.

Multimeters all come with instruction booklets, which explain in far greater detail how to accurately use the meter. A very basic multimeter can be purchased for \$20 or less at a hardware store. Test lamps are even cheaper, but they won't help you find hidden breaks in wires like a multimeter can.

Multimeters look complicated, but the functions of the meter needed to troubleshoot your Model A's electrical system – from ignition to lighting – are the easiest to use.

Be sure to check the lining, too. Friction wear in the lining is most common under the arms and at the bottom edges, as well as around the neck.
