



This should be our largest picnic yet. If you can help with set-up – cooking – games – clean-up let any board member know.







### **Reminiscing With the Historian**

FIFTY YEARS AGO - 1960 - No information is available.

FORTY FIVE YEARS AGO, 1965 - Thirteen A's participated in an economy run that started at 27<sup>th</sup> and Capitol Drive and ended in Hustisford. Wes Campbell won first place and averaged 24.4 mpg.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1970 - The first outdoor event of the season was an economy run through the Kettle Moraine area and ended at Phantom Lake. Art Peterson won first place, averaging 26.6 mpg.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1975 - We participated in a Memorial Day parade in Sturtevant. A poker run rally was held, starting at Brookfield Square, covering 49 miles, and ending up with a potluck dinner.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1980 - We participated in the Menomonee Falls Memorial Day parade and the Wisconsin State Lions Convention parade. The 15<sup>th</sup> annual swap meet was held at State Fair Park.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1985 - We toured the Golden Rondelle Theatre in Racine, which is owned by Johnson Wax Co. We viewed two documentary films. Then we toured the Wind Point lighthouse.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1990 - An overnight tour took us to Oshkosh, where we stayed at the Hilton Hotel. A second tour took us to Bob Adams Antique Mall in Caledonia. The month ended with a Memorial Day parade in Elm Grove.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1995 - We were invited to the Story Hill Open House tour. The residents of Story Hill opened their homes to the public and we were asked to park our A's in their driveways.

TEN YEARS AGO, 2000 - A Memorial Day weekend was hosted by the Rozmans and Stegners. We stayed at the Park Plaza Valley Inn.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2005 - Twenty Model A's and ten modern cars turned out for the high roller tour hosted by Fast Eddie and Lucky Gene, and their wives Lorraine and Joan.

### A CHECKLIST OF SUGGESTED ROUTINE PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES FOR THE MODEL A

### A. AT EACH FUEL STOP

- 1. Check crankcase oil level
- 2. Check radiator water level
- Perform a quick visual inspection of the engine compartment, the crankcase, the undercarriage, the tires and the overall condition of your car

### B. DAILY

- 1. Check the distributor point spacing
- Check the water pump for leaks and play
- 3. Check the radiator, hoses and head gasket for water leaks
- Check the carburetor and fuel line for leaks
- Visually inspect the engine compartment, crankcase and undercarriage for abnormal oil leaks or other irregularities
- Check the hubs, wheels and tires for abnormalities
- Be ever watchful for loose nuts, loose bolts or loose electrical connections

### C. WEEKLY OR EVERY 1,000 MILES

- Check the battery water level. If water is being boiled away, reduce the charging rate
- 2. Lubricate the distributor bearings and the distributor cam
- 3. Lubricate the water pump bearings
- 4. Lubricate the generator
- 5. Check the fan for cracks. Is the hub tight?
- Check the fan belt for tension and wear
- Examine the tires for breaks, cracks or abnormal wear. Check air pressure
- 8. If necessary, re-torque all lug nuts

### D. EVERY 2,000 MILES

- 1. Grease all lube fittings
- Change crankcase oil and filter. Those without a filter may wish to change oil more frequently. Examine the sludge on the drain plug for any warning signs.
- Check differential, transmission and steering gear oil levels
- 4. Add grease to "U" joint (only if necessary)
- Drain the carburetor bowl and sediment bowl. Examine the deposits. Check fuel flow rate

### E. EVERY 5,000 MILES

- 1. Remove, examine and regap the spark plugs
- 2. Check compression
- 3. Check and adjust the ignition timing
- Inspect the brake system. Readjust wedge at each wheel as necessary
- 5. Re-torque the rear wheel axle nuts
- 6. Change the differential and transmission oil

### F. EVERY 10,000 MILES

- 1. Drop the engine pan and adjust the rods and mains\*
- Check valve tappet clearances. Take careful note of compression values. Do not grind valves if unnecessary. If one or more need attention, a complete valve job is recommended.
- Remove front hubs. Inspect brake lining, shoes, drums and actuating mechanism. Inspect bearings and races. Check for unusual grease deposits. Repack.
- Remove rear hubs. Inspect linings, shoes, drums and actuating mechanism. Inspect bearings, seals, keys and keyways. Repack and reassemble.
- 5. Lubricate speedometer shaft
- 6. Rotate the tires
