



Mike reporting for Tony nothing to report



We will use the West Pavilion and East Expo Center where each aisle vending space will be approximately 11' X 9' and is \$40. Wall spaces may vary in size depending on location in either building and are \$45.

We have space available for car clubs to help promote their special interest to the public. Clubs may use these spaces to sell their club merchandise and/or hand out club literature, <u>spot not to be used for selling car parts.</u> Those spaces are \$30 and are approximately 3' X 11" and include one free table (no credit given if table not used) and admittance for two people.

- 1.) Returning vendors will have the option to occupy the same space(s) they did in 2022, however your payment and completed application **must be returned us by November 7, 2022** to insure your same space(s).
- 2.) After November 7, 2022 any available spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. We will honor your space requests as best as we can, however, <u>WE DO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ASSIGN VENDOR LOCATION. WE ALSO RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO SELL SPACES TO PAST "NO SHOW" VENDORS.</u>
- 3.) Maximum number of spaces for a vendor is limited to 6, to help ensure a more diverse selection of swap merchandise. Each space rental includes 2 free admission wrist bands.
- 4.) <u>The event is advertised from 8:00 am till 2:00 pm. It is expected that all vendors will sell their wares until 1:00 pm. THIS IS MANDITORY OR YOU ARE JEOPARDIZING YOUR SPOT FOR FUTURE EVENTS.</u>
- 5.) Vendors MUST vacate building by 4:00 p.m.
- 6.) Spots are not guaranteed due to circumstances beyond our control.

All other spaces will be available until we are sold out.

You will receive a letter shortly after January 10, 2023, confirming your building, space location, your arrival time and wrist bands for your space(s). Please arrive at your designated time only. Wearing your wrist band is <u>required</u> the day of the show.





"Cars and Clubs" from an article in the November 1981 newsletter:

½ lb cubed pork ½ lb cubed veal ½ pkg Kluski noodles

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 small can whole kernel corn

1 green pepper, chopped

1 can water

1 (4 oz) pkg cheddar cheese

1 can cream of mushroom soup

In the Rearview Mirror...

On September 18th, 2022, twenty-eight people met at the McDonalds in Big Bend. Although the weather report called for a chance rain, there were nine Model A's, two Model T's, one 1946 Ford, one early Ford Mustang and some modern cars that were part of our group. (The rain never appeared and we had sunshine all day.) The group left the restaurant and headed east through Mukwonago and some beautiful countryside arriving at Rushing Waters Fishery in Palmyra where we were greeted by our tour guide – Kyle.

Kyle showed us many of the fresh water ponds where the rainbow trout are raised. As they mature, they are moved to different ponds and after 9 months or so they are old enough to be sold. On site they have 1.2 million fish from fingerlings to adults. They do not breed fish on sight but get their female eggs from Norway or Denver Colorado and they only take one day to ship. The survival rate of the female eggs to adulthood is 88%- note they do not raise male trout. Vicki and Dennis Cooper tried their hand at fishing and caught three fish

in the fishing pond.

After some fishing and shopping the group left Rushing Waters and took the country roads to the Apple Barn and Winery in Elkhorn. We enjoyed the music being played by a local group, eating apple cider donuts, drinking some fresh apple cider and having some lunch. A few members of the club enjoyed some wine tasting while others went apple picking in the orchard. The group had a wonderful time and had a great time visiting with each other.

The group then left the Apple Barn and Winery and headed to Gus's Custard Stand in East Troy. All of us enjoyed our custard/food and reminisced about the day we had. A number of customers at Gus's asked about the history of our cars and wondered if they could take pictures. That ended the tour.

Linda and I want to thank everyone who attended the tour and we hope everyone had a great time. It is always good to see everyone.

In the Rearview Mirror...

Cedarburg Fire Station Tour Sunday, October 9, 2022

Fourteen Model A's, two Vintage Mustangs, and six modern iron vehicles started A tour from Menomonee Falls on A beautiful Wisconsin Model A late morning.

Stan and Pat led the way in their Mustang with the top down. For our first point of interest, we drove through the aromatic Menomonee Falls Dump. We learned you pay to dump your garbage and Menomonee Falls gets the money!

We continued on our way past the location of the first Lutheran Church which was A log cabin built in 1840. This was eight years before Wisconsin became a state. The present church was built in 1884.

A short drive down the road found us traveling past Boeklke Hardware Store which opened in 1927. This was an old fashioned hardware store with tools and lots of things.

A few miles later we reached our destination, The Cedarburg Fire Station. In 1866, men with great vision founded the all volunteer Cedarburg Fire Department. Original members of the fire department with help from other community members, took great pride in constructing their first firehouse. Members were required to donate work time and two (\$2) dollars each toward construction costs of the first firehouse. By 1908, the department moved to its quarters on Mequon Avenue. There is a museum of antique apparatus and equipment in A building attached to the garage of the present day volunteer Cedarburg Fire Station equipment.



Throughout more than 150 years, the all volunteer Fire Department has continued to serve, maintaining a mutually beneficial relationship between the community of Cedarburg and the Fire Department. With much foresight and planning, the Department has been financially independent, much to the benefit of Cedarburg citizens. The costs of firefighting vehicles and personnel compensation, absorbed by the volunteer Department has had A positive effect on taxpayer savings of more than \$10,000,000.00!

We first entered the area where the vintage fire fighting equipment is preserved in pristine condition. We listened to an interesting and informative talk about the Fire Station by retired fire chief Rich Van Diner.

We also welcomed two brand new members who enjoyed their first Wisconsin Chapter Model A outdoor event. Before we moved on to the modern fire apparatus, on behalf of Mike Brojanac, Stan presented a commerative Cedarburg Fire Station 1866 -1966 mug to retired chief, Rich Van Diner.



At the conclusion of our tour, Stan and Pat once again, led the way from the Fire Station down quiet scenic roads to the Mequon Pizza Parlor. We were treated to A video of A Model A Shotgun Wedding for our viewing pleasure while we dined on pizza at Mequon Pizza. We noticed the video was filmed several years ago traveling the same roads we had been on.

Everyone seemed to enjoy visiting as well as the excellent pizza and beverages. It was A Perfect Model A Day!.

A Side Note:

The present day owner of the original Cedarburg Fire Station is Stan Larson. A ceremony was held and the building now displays a plaque which speaks of the department's first Fire Chief Fred Schatz and his vision in 1866 to create a self- supporting fire company - a tradition that still endures today. The dedication was held on June 11, 2021, (exactly 154 years to the date of the original firehouse meeting on June 11, 1867). Mr. Larson unveiled the customized plaque and presented a check for \$500 to the department, the original paid price for the property.
