



NOTICE FOR THE NOVEMBER INDOOR MEET:

Proposed by-law changes:

1.) Article III, Section 2, Paragraph A– Remove #1 (First year - red on yellow badge) and adjust #2 to read "first to ten years" - black on yellow badge.

2.) Article V, Section 5 reads: Notice of a special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given at least two days previous thereto by a written notice delivered personally or sent by mail or by telegram (Remove the "or by telegram") to each director at his address as shown by the records of the corporation. Any director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting.

A quick note from the secretary:

I want to answer a couple comments I've seen written on returned dues renewal forms.

"Why more?" was the first comment. The dues are the same as they were last year, nothing has changed. "Why so early?" was the second comment. If dues renewal forms were mailed out, they would be mailed the middle of October. Since we are using the newsletter as a way of delivering the renewal notice to members, it had to go into the October issue. Member renewal dues are due by the end of the year.

Please use the renewal form ONLY and mail it to my home address, NOT the post office box. Checks need to be made out to WI Chapter MAFCA, not me personally.





FIFTY YEARS AGO, 1960 - No information is available.

FORTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1965 - License fees for collector cars were going up from \$9.75 to \$11.75. This was the first time plate fees had increased since 1947.

FORTY YEARS AGO, 1970 - Movies were shown at the first indoor meet, held at Stanton's Hall on 52nd and Bluemound.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1975 - A brake seminar was held at Brojanac's Brake Shop. The first indoor meet was held at Stanton's Hall. A racing movie was shown and there was a slide presentation of the "High Country Meet" in Vail, Colorado.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1980 - The first indoor meet was an ice cream social held at St. Aloysius. Entertainment was provided by a barber shop quartet. The first seminar was held at Brojanac's Brake Shop, and featured a representative from the 3M Company.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1985 - We were invited to participate in the West Allis Christmas Parade. The indoor meet was a slide presentation entitled "A Summer of Touring '85". A seminar was given on engine rebuilding.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1990 - A movie on the making of the Dillinger movie was featured at the indoor meet. Many of our members' cars were in this movie. We had a seminar at Classic Pros in Sussex on how to pinstripe a car.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, 1995 - The indoor meet featured hors d'oeuvre sampling. The first seminar was held at Avenue Brake Shop. Todd Gillette from Gillette's Body Shop spoke on how to protect against corrosion.

TEN YEARS AGO, 2000 - The indoor meet featured a review of movies from our summer trip to Kansas City and Dearborn. The seminar was on installing seat belts.

FIVE YEARS AGO, 2005 - Stan and Pat Larson hosted a dessert swap event at the indoor meet. The subject of the technical seminar was installing directional signals.

Light Emitting Diodes (LED)

In the Fall 2005 issue of the Model A Times we introduced our readers to the LED brake and tail light conversion. In the article we explained what LED's were and how you received a brighter light and consumed less electricity. While these were an easy replacement mounted behind the original Model A lens they were not perfect. When installing the conversion we were instructed to crumple paper and use that to fill the tail light to hold the LED's next to the lenses of the tail light. While this worked it did allow for the assembly to move some and the LED's were not aimed directly back and you lose some of the brightness.

The solution has arrived. While attending the Specialty Equipment Marketing Show (SEMA) last Fall, we found United Pacific Industries, Inc. They manufacture a variety of LED replacement tail light lenses and include the Model A tail lights in their collection.

We ordered both the right and left and all red and the red amber combination for our testing. They are nicely packaged on a card. The assembly and components are very well done, obviously under close scrutiny for correctness. While it will be obvious to a judge these are not glass lenses, they are polycarbonate which is a very durable material.



When the lenses arrived they were set up for the entire light to operate together. The two segments of the lens will be on for tail light and get brighter for brake light operation. We preferred this operation, but there are instructions for those who choose to operate the brake and tail light individually as original.

They supply 6 volt positive ground and 12 volt negative ground lenses. The LED's use less power, so they will work well with a Model A using a 6 volt generator. This gives a good option for brighter tail lights and staying with the 6 volt generator.

United Pacific only sells wholesale but and these lenses are available through Bratton's, Snyder's, Sacramento Vintage, MAC's Antique Auto and many more. Check with your local parts supplier for availability.

WE ENERGIES JOHNSBURG WINDMILL TOUR Wisconsin MAFCA 10/10/10

It was a beautiful warm fall day with winding country roads, good friends and lunch in a cozy small town café. What else could there be? Oh education, now we all know more about the latest power trend, giant windmills.

Our tour was on a picture perfect day. A tour through the Northern Kettle Moraine with fall colors and falling leaves. Just for us, autumn canopies of yellow leaves made tunnels for the winding country roads.

Dairy farms and cow smells, some of the biggest milking barns I have ever seen.

The weather attracted a crowd 54 bodies with 13 model A's and 11 other cars.

Our drive began in Germantown, headed north through the Kettle Moraine toward our final destination, the WE energies Blue Sky Wind farm. Enroute we stopped for lunch at Captain Jack's in St Cloud. Blue Sky has the largest windmills in Wisconsin. We learned there are bigger farms and windmills in the works.

Some facts we learned:

- 397' from the base to the top of the blade (when it is vertical)
- The generator on top is about the length of 2 full size cars or the size of a school bus
- Each blade is 172 feet long
- The tower is 262' to the nacelle
- Weights: rotor 47 tons, Nacelle 57 tons, tower 100 tons
- Operational wind speed 14 mph
- Cut in wind speed 8 mph
- Cut out wind speed 54 mph
- Optimum wind speed 30 mph
- Capacity of the 88 windmills is 145 megawatts or enough for 36,000 homes if it ran all the time
- Location built on the Niagara escarpment which is higher than the ground around it

We also learned that since there is no practical way to store electricity so for each watt of wind power there must be a back up plant to supply power when the wind does not blow. We learned the wind blows most on cold winter nights when demand is low and least on hot August days when demand for power is high.

What does windmill power cost? Is it supplemented by the government and how?

Our Blue Sky Wind Farm cost about \$300 million.

Wind power today is supplemented by a federal production tax credit (PTC) of \$0.021 per kWH produced, for the first 10 years of operation. This would work out to about \$7 million per year for a wind farm the size of Blue Sky.

What happens when there is no wind?

For our generating system, in any given hour, about 0 to 3% of our generation is derived from wind turbines. When the wind is not blowing, our coal and our gas plants increase their output to make up for the difference in generation.

What happens when there is too much wind?

From the standpoint of the wind turbine itself, it is designed to cut out at 54 mph. It accomplishes this by automatically feathering the blades and turning out of the wind.

From the standpoint of our electrical supply system, if the percentage of wind generation capacity is large, then excess power would need to be sent elsewhere or fossil plants and/or wind turbines would need to turn down or shut down in order to match the load with the generation.

What is the reliability?

In 2009, Blue Sky operated at a 26% capacity factor. If the wind blew more, the capacity factor would be higher.

In Wisconsin, the strongest wind tends to blow at night and in the winter. Our electrical systems highest need for power is during hot summer afternoons.

The wind turbine machinery is fairly reliable, especially when properly maintained. Lightning strikes can occasionally take out a unit for a few days here and there.

Our wind turbines are taken out of service for several days each spring and fall in order to perform the required inspection and maintenance on each unit.

How long do they last?

The wind farm has an anticipated life of 30 years.
