
We plan to continue work on building a Model A chassis from the ground up.



Handy Henry's Helpful Hints

Well, it is time to get the "A" in the barn for the winter. This is a caution for the use of STA-BILL and similar products. The directions read fill the tank or container to 95% of FRESH fuel. This is to lessen the space for condensation to form in the tank or if you prefer a dry tank, drain most of the fuel and add STA-BIL.

Use 1 oz. of STA-BIL to 2 ½ gallons of fuel. Run engine for five minutes or so to distribute the STA-BIL. STA-BIL is only good for two years after breaking the seal. There is a line on the back of the bottle that says---- "STA-BIL can be used for up to two years after opening the bottle."

Use a Sharpie pen to write the opening date on the bottle.

Dave Boucher called the meeting to order at 7:18 p.m.

President – Dave B.—We received the newsletters from the reciprocating clubs. There are still some club accessories in stock (hats, flags and banners) and we will be selling them at the next indoor meet at a reduced cost. We will no longer be stocking these items. We will be keeping a few bumper banners for club events.

Vice President/New Membership/National Correspondent and Sunshine – Steve L. –

No new members this month. Stan Larson has been chosen to go on an Honor Flight November 2nd, 2013. It was mentioned the new printers are doing a good job with printing the "Wheeling".

Secretary – Dave H.- No corrections to the minutes from the 9/17/13 BOD meeting. A motion was made by Paul P. and seconded by Steve L. to accept the minutes as written. To date, we have two hundred and sixty-six members. A copy of the renewal notice was passed around and discussed. There were no corrections or changes so it will be published in the November, December and January issues of "Wheeling".

Treasurer – Paul P.- A report of the revenue and expenses from last month was gone over. Paul mentioned we are financially sound. A motion was made by Dave H. and seconded by Steve to accept the treasurer's report. The contract for St. Aloysius was presented and a check was given to Mike Y. to reserve the hall. The church would not do a two year contract. Bills were presented by Dave B. for the chili dump tour. Mike Y. made a motion to accept the bill and it was seconded by Steve. Dave B. turned in income from the sale of vendor spaces for our 2014 swap meet. A check for \$50.00 from S+S Research was received as a donation for our 2014 banquet and was given to Paul.

Outdoor – Mike C.- The chili dump, our last outdoor tour, is October 13, 2013. We reviewed the 2014 outdoor event schedule.

Other Model A clubs in the state are going to donate to the concrete work at the Rapids reunion site. The board held some discussion as to whether we should also make a donation. Mike Y. made a motion to give a donation for the concrete work and it was seconded by Steve L. The volunteer thank you dinner is October 26th. Volunteer positions are open to change if anyone is interested. A discussion was held about the fall charity. A motion was made by Steve L. to have the Honor Flight as our fall charity, it was seconded by Dave B. The board discussed about having a commemorative brick at the Gilmore Model A Museum listing the founding board members of our club. Dave B. mentioned we have several options – several bricks, a plague, or have their names listed in a showcase in the museum. What are the judging standards?

How do you know if your car is original or has been modified? One way is to compare your car to the restoration guidelines and judging standards.

Both national Model A clubs, the Model A Ford Club of America and the Model A Restorers Club, have jointly published a reference book called "Model A Restoration Guidelines & Judging Standards."

The authors of the book, over many years and after examining countless Model A's, have defined the appearance of our Model A's year by year, model by model, as they came off the Ford assembly line.

This reference book, actually an inch-thick loose-leaf binder, contains written descriptions, drawings, and photos of our Model A's from the design of the oil cap to the number of pleats in the backrest of a rumble seat. The book covers 23 sections, called areas. Some of the areas included are the engine compartment, cooling system, exhaust, brakes, roof, glass and side curtains, interior trim, exterior plating, lights, and even windshield wipers. There are also pages devoted to Model A heavy trucks, mail trucks, and to Canadian-built Model A's.

The restoration guidelines and judging standards are useful, even if you never intend to enter your car in a judging competition.

For example, last year at one of the club's technical meets we learned how to use paint to add a wood-grain effect to the dashboard and trim pieces of our cars. I wondered if my Victoria's solid black dashboard was originally wood-grained. The judging standards say yes, it was one of the models that originally came with a mahogany wood-grained dash. Some Town Sedans, and slant-window Cabriolets and Convertible Sedans also had wood-graining, but in walnut instead of mahogany.

I also confirmed that my car was built in April 1931 or later. According to the standards, that's when Ford moved the gasoline shutoff valve to the engine side of the firewall, where it is on my car.

My car is black with Apple Green wheels. Is that a correct Ford color combination? Yes, according to the judging standards.

They state that prior to June 1930, wheels were black. But afterward, colored wheels were available as a Ford accessory on all passenger cars, and a handful of DeLuxe models came with colored wheels standard. Apple Green was one of the colors from June 1930 onward. The judging standards also confirm that the green pinstripe on my car is also appropriate.

Besides checking cars for originality, the judging standards have other uses. Two years ago when I replaced a muffler, I was unsure which way to install the exhaust pipe clamp near the rear axle. The judging standards include a diagram showing two styles of clamps and the correct way to fasten them to the frame rail.

The judging standards book costs \$25 plus shipping from MAFCA, and usually Model A parts stores also sell the book. From time to time, sections of the standards are updated, and since the judging standards are in a loose-leaf binder, you can easily keep your book up to date without buying an entire new one. – Neil Besougloff, technical meet chairman

What we think of Polka dots 2648—That they are having an enormous vogue, that they will be represented at every fashionable gathering, that they are smartest when small, and that they are especially good for this delightful frock. It has a most interesting skirt with flared drapes attached in a new way. The sleeves are long, the belt narrow, and a jabot falls from the crossed neck-line.

The Sleeve for the Sleeveless 2668—The very brief kimono sleeve came into popularity with the vogue for sun-browned arms. This frock is typical of both these phases of the mode. Its two-piece flared skirt, sewed to the long body, may be cut bias or straight, depending on the type of ripple you like. A unique scarf-collar slips through slashes in the front.

In the Newest Pastel 2681—The couturiers -notably Lelong- are sponsoring the new "chalky" pastels in dull greens, blues, oranges. These are effective for a frock of this sort. Its gathered skirt is smartly draped, the sleeves are long and the touch of lace at the neck is distinguished. As this frock has a straight lower edge, it can be made in lace, with the scalloped edge at the hem. It has a wide crushed girdle.


