Change to be voted on at the member meeting on November 8, 2009.

SECTION 2. NUMBER, TENURE AND QUALIFICATIONS



Important Information from the Board of Directors:



Oil Pump Shield

In the July August Service Bulletins from Ford Motor Company they showed an improvement in the oil pan. A shield was developed to restrict the movement of oil away from the oil pump on sharp turns (A-6631). This shield maintains a better oil supply to the pump, which in turn maintains a constant flow of oil to the splash tray and main bearings, extending the life of the engine, according to the service bulletins.

This is a modification that should be considered when rebuilding a Model A engine, or is an improvement that could be installed with the engine in the ear. The pan and oil pump need to be removed, as the shield is held in place by the oil pump. You simply slide the shield onto the pump where it attaches to the engine drive gear. There is a hole that engages the lug on the pump, slide it onto the lug and replace the pump, reinstall the pan and your engine will have a more even distribution of oil, per the Ford Service Bulletins.


