

The Veteran's parade took place in Milwaukee on November 6 and was hosted by Ed and Joyce Churchill.



Looking back...

Cozy Nook Farm

On September 26th, 2021, twenty-one people with seven Model A's, a 1937 Ford and two modern cars left McDonalds in Big Bend for a journey through the country side headed to the Cozy Nook Farm near Delafield. The journey took the group through four counties, rolling hills and the wooded country side. After a two-hour drive, we arrived at the Cozy Nook Farm and were greeted by Tom Oberhaus. The group was given the history of the farm which started in 1834 near the present day Goerkes Corners. In 1957, the land was purchased by the State of Wisconsin to build I-94 and the move was made to the Delafield area. Most of the 65 cows are Guernsey and Brown Swiss which we had an opportunity to



meet. Tom took us to the milking parlor and gave us an explanation of the milking process. The cows get milked twice a day – morning and night- and once they are done, they are head back to the barn or pasture to enjoy the day and get fed. Tom shared a lot of information with us but the one item that stands out is that Wisconsin was not always a dairy state. For many years Wisconsin was known for its grain.

Tom and his Kathy have a breeding program and there are many of their cows throughout the world. People which come to their farm from other countries to see their cows and to make arrangements to get involved with their breeding program. There is not a bull on site as they can be a "challenge".

Once the tour of the farm was over, the group went on a hay ride. We enjoyed the scenery, got to feed some cows, and had good conversation. Once we finished our visit at Cozy Nook Farms, we headed to LeDuc's Custard to have some sweet goodies.

The weather was perfect, as was the company. I would like to thank all of those that attended the tour including Mike and Dan Zahoric from the Model T club.
