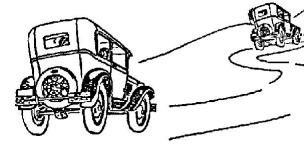

Who was Clara Bryant?



No, Clara Bryant was not an elder member of our Model 'A' club.

Clara Bryant was born in Wayne County, Michigan, on April 11, 1866, to Melvin S. Bryant and Martha Bench. She grew up in the Detroit area and attended Greenfield Township District No. 3 School. Clara first met Henry at a New Year's dance in Michigan in 1885. During their courtship, they enjoyed such activities as dancing, corn-husking parties and boating excursions. On April 11, 1888, 24-year-old Henry Ford married Clara Jane Bryant on her 22nd birthday at her parent's home in Greenfield Township, Michigan.

After their marriage, the Fords lived on farm land given to Henry by his father. By 1891, however, the couple moved to Detroit, where Henry Ford began working as an engineer for Edison Illuminating Company. The couple's only child, Edsel, was born in November 1893. During the early years of their marriage, the couple lived in 10 different rental homes while Henry worked to develop an automobile. After incorporating the Ford Motor Company in 1903, Henry launched the Model T in 1908. The car, which was in production until 1927, held the record for the world's top-selling vehicle until it was surpassed by the Volkswagen Beetle in 1972.

In 1915, the Fords moved into a mansion built on land they owned in Dearborn, Michigan. The home, named Fair Lane, included an indoor swimming pool, billiard room, bowling alley and dance floor, as the Fords had always liked to dance.

Clara became an avid gardener and horticulturist, serving as the president of the National Farm and Garden Bureau for eight years and was named the first president of the Garden Club of Dearborn, Michigan. From 1924-1932, she was the president of the Women's National Farm and Garden's Association. During this time, she began a "Roadside Market" program enabling women to earn their own income by selling their home grown produce at roadside stands.

Clara was known for avoiding the public spotlight but she did hold power in the Ford company. She was with Henry Ford at the first test of the gasoline engine in 1891 and he is quoted as calling her a "believer" saying that she was the only one who believed in his idea of a motor carriage.

Clara became an outspoken activist for women's suffrage. As a woman who was born into privilege and also married into privilege, she realized that not all women had the same opportunities afforded to her. She believed women needed to have the right to vote in order to gain full participation in society and have a voice about the issues that affected their lives.

In 1918, she was elected Vice-Chair of the Equal Suffrage League of Wayne County. One of the goals of this organization was to secure the right for women to vote in Michigan. Achieving this depended upon persuading men to vote "yes" to amending the state constitution. Clara Ford often held meetings at her Fair Lane estate and, in October of 1918, they held two meetings at the Ford tractor plant in Detroit where they distributed literature, pins, and stickers to the more than 7,000 attendees.

In 1921, she served on the Board of Directors of the Michigan League of Women Voters. She was inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Michigan Women's in 2017.

The spring 2019 issue of the Dearborn Historian wrote that Clara Bryant Ford had made it her life's mission to improve the life and welfare of women and those in poverty-stricken areas across the country. She and her husband established and funded many programs focusing on women's rights, education, healthcare, and environmentalism. These included Vista Maria, originally an orphanage for girls, the School of Nursing and Hygiene at Henry Ford Hospital, and Planned Parenthood from 1945 until her death on September 29, 1950.

Henry Ford died at the age of 83 on April 7, 1947; Clara Ford died three years later, on September 29, 1950, at the age of 84. Their son Edsel, who worked for the family business, preceded both his parents in death, dying at the age of 49 from cancer on May 26, 1943.

This month we feature 'Butterscotch Dessert' (*Sue Quam, from Wi Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking*)

1 ½ sticks butter	9 oz. Cool Whip
1 ½ c. flour	2 pkg. instant butterscotch pudding (good with Lemon or Chocolate pudding)
1 c. chopped walnuts	3 c. milk
8 oz. cream cheese	1 c. powdered sugar

Mix butter, flour and nuts. Put into a 9 x 13 inch pan; press around sides and bottom. Bake 15 – 20 minutes at 350 degrees.

Mix cream cheese, powdered sugar and 2 cup Cool Whip. Cream real well together. Spread on top of cooled crust.

Mix 2 packages of instant pudding and 3 cups of milk. Put that on top of the cream cheese mixture.

Top with remaining Cool Whip; sprinkle some crushed nuts on top.

Also very good with chocolate or lemon pudding. The lemon is a real refreshing dessert.

A few fun facts about Thanksgiving

- In 1926, President Calvin Coolidge was gifted a live raccoon, who was intended to be on the table instead of a turkey for the First Family's Thanksgiving meal. He and First Lady Grace Coolidge weren't inclined to eat the masked creature, however. Instead, they adopted the raccoon, gave her the name Rebecca, and kept her as a White House pet.
- The first large-scale balloon used in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade was Felix the Cat in 1927, replacing the earlier zoo animals that were used in the first three iterations of the parade. Because there were no plans yet for deflating the balloons, most were simply allowed to float away afterwards. Unfortunately, this strategy didn't prove very effective, as most popped shortly after being released.
- Approximately 50 million Americans tune in to the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade each year. Another 3.5 million people view it in person, and roughly 10,000 participate—in non-pandemic years, at least. And though the parade doesn't begin until 9 a.m. ET, many spectators arrive as early as 6:30 a.m.—lining the streets of New York—to get a spot along the route.
- In the midst of the Great Depression, President Franklin D. Roosevelt moved Thanksgiving up one week in order to allow more time for shopping before Christmas. Otherwise, it would have fallen on Nov. 30. The move spurred intense public reaction, though none as memorable as the stunt pulled by Atlantic City's then-mayor, C.D. White. In a public statement issued the day before the new Thanksgiving as designated by Roosevelt, White announced that his city would celebrate two days of thanks and that the earlier date would be known as "Franksgiving."



MAFCA announces 50 Year Award Program

Each year one of the privileges for the Chapter Coordinator for MAFCA is to recognize those chapters who have achieved certain milestones in their history for their years of continuous operation. This is done by awarding a certificate of achievement designating that milestone. These are then delivered to each chapter to display. We are proud to announce a new program to enhance this.

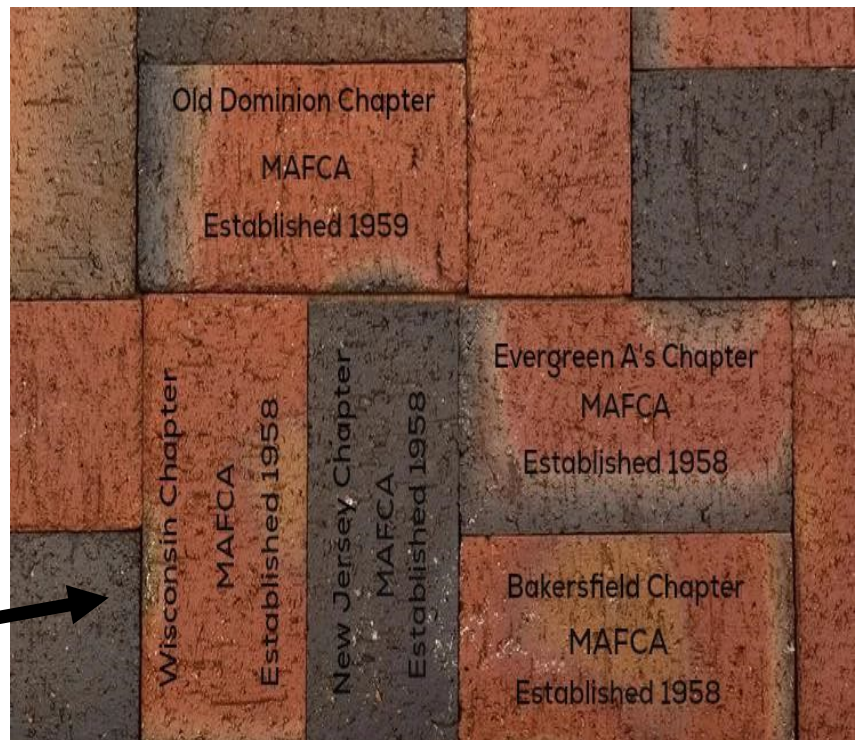
This year by unanimous vote the MAFCA Board of Directors and in an agreement with MAFFI and the Model "A" Ford Museum we approved to begin recognizing those chapters who have achieved the high honor of 50 years of continuous membership in the Model "A" Ford Club of America in a special way. For those chapters an inscribed brick will be placed on behalf of MAFCA at the Model "A" Museum by the Model "A" Ford Foundation or MAFFI. This permanent enshrinement of this accomplishment will be on display 365 days a year to celebrate this high honor.

We cannot however just begin this recognition in 2023. We must also look back to past award recipients as well as look at our current winners. To do so 94 bricks will be ordered this year that will include all prior 50 year Chapter Longevity Award winners. This begins with our first chapter, the Bakersfield, California Club, as well as including the 2023 and 2024 winners which will be placed in time for the 2024 Model "A" Days celebration. Each year after a brick will be placed

in honor of those 50 year chapters reaching this milestone. Those recognized in this sidewalk of 50 year Chapter Longevity Winners is meant to demonstrate their special place in MAFCA's history and their significance in the success of MAFCA.

It is our hope that with this permanent recognition and placement of these bricks, those MAFCA members and others who visit the museum, will feel the same sense of pride and accomplishment in these recipient's as the Model A Ford Club of America does.

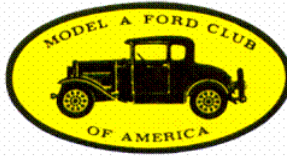
