



TECHNICAL SEMINAR

October Technical Seminar - October 19th

Over the past few years we have had seminars covering the brake systems on the Model A. We learned how to assemble backing plates and what to look for when checking the braking system.

We need to remember that brakes on a Model A are much more than a new set of brake linings. In order for a mechanical system like the Model A brakes to work properly and provide safe driving and stopping, the system must be in good condition from front to back.

All of the brake rods, clevises and operating arms and levers must be snug fitting. Brake drums must be within specs (not many originals fit this description), and linings must be clean and in good shape. Many times the brake cross shafts are ignored. These also need to be repaired.

After repairing all of these things we needed to properly adjust the complete system. When that was completed, we then had a safe and reliable brake system.

Recently there has been a new product developed that claims to improve the brake system dramatically. As much as a 60% improvement.

This product is a set of floaters for both the front and rear wheels. It is a true full floating 100% servo action. This eliminates the need to center the brake shoes when doing a brake job. It is done automatically by the new brake floaters. The floaters actually make the brakes work like drum brakes with primary and secondary shoes.

The 14 piece kit takes 2 to 3 hours to install and does not require any drilling, welding or

modifications. The components bolt onto the existing backing plate holes at the top adjuster and bottom anchor pin and eliminates the need to build up the lower track. The rear components fit onto the top adjuster. If required, your brakes can return to the standard components without any hassle.

There has been much discussion about this system on the internet and so far there seems to be no bad reports. On a recent Wednesday (Huckster Day) a few of us were discussing the upcoming season of Technical Seminars and we realized there was nothing scheduled for October. Someone said why not have a seminar about these brake floaters? All we needed was a set of the floaters and somebody that has a car with a fully repaired brake system and the desire to make them even better. Bob Sonnen then volunteered his car that had recently had a brake job.

For this seminar we will begin at 6:30.

We will test drive Bob's car to feel the current brakes. At 7:00 we will bring the car into the shop to install the new floaters. We will need enough people willing to work on all four wheels at one time so we can complete the job in about an hour and one half.

When finished we will take the car outside and test drive it again. If everything goes according to plan, we should experience a major improvement in the stopping capabilities.

This should be a great learning experience for all of us and if we are lucky, Bob will have a better braking system.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1971---Twenty Model A's participated in a 50 mile tour of the Kettle Moraine ending in Genesee at "Klix's Tavern". We were entertained with a Square Dance Show put on by the "Flutter Wheels".

THIRTY YEARS AGO, 1976---See special insert "Parade of Model A's".

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1981—Thirteen members participated in an overnight tour of Door County. We also had a Fall Tour of Colors in the Holy Hill area hosted by Ron Smith. Refreshments were served at Dretzka Park.

TWENTY YEARS AGO, 1986—On a cold, damp and windy Sunday Thirty-seven cars braved a thirty-five mile tour on the hilly roads surrounding Holy Hill. The tour ended at John Lamm's Garden Center. Due to heavy rains our hay ride was shorten.

Reminiscing with the Historian Continued..

Parade of Model A's Wheezes to Sheboygan

Sheboygan, Wis. — There was a Ford motorcade without politics Sunday, the Fall Foliage Tour of 44 Model A's through brilliant countryside.

People smiled and waved as the dependable — well, almost — vehicles chattered along, from Northridge Shopping Center in Milwaukee to a general store in Sheboygan. The harshest notes came from the uah-uah of the Ford's horns.

Whenever the cars, of 1928-'31 vintage, seemed to be breathing hard, there was a stop of scenic beauty or historic significance. The drivers pulled up to snap pictures at the Covered Bridge, slowed to observe old lime kilns, to let ducks pass or to enjoy the nostalgia — antedating the cars themselves — at the ghost town of Hamilton.

Car restorers put comfort in the back seat for authenticity. In the case of Mr. and Mrs. James Mayer of Milwaukee, that meant tucking their children, James, 6, and Chris, 9, in the rumble seat. It

got a bit breezy, but James did the obvious thing: He crawled under the storage area. Both wore hooded outfits, as did another couple of girls, who rode in the back end of a Model A pickup.

Many Models

The motorcade had a variety of models as well as riders. There was a Model A mail truck, restored to its wooden plank sides and painted that awful olive drab by Larry, Koser, 49, and his son, Gary, 25, of 13645 Serene La., Brookfield.

There was a rare 1931 Victoria coupe, only 30,000 of which were made, according to the owner, David Roethig, deputy public works commissioner of Milwaukee. He had bought it from Glendale's former mayor, Jerry Gruen, then brought it back to its former glory in burgundy paint and soft tan top. Roethig called the car "Henry Ford's first bid for the ladies' business."

There was the distinctive blue phaeton of Bill Walton, Ford dealer at Sheboygan. It already was here and thus didn't make the trip, but it drew admiring glances from auto hobbyists after they arrived. Walton said that he had started collecting antique Lincolns and Packards in Detroit, but scaled down to Model A's when he moved to a smaller community.

Charles Hickling, 1900 E. Olive St., Shorewood, retired budget supervisor for — of all people, General Motors — brought his 1930 roadster. He said he had rescued it from a fate worse than death, being converted to a hotrod by teenage boys. But several of the drivers, of various ages, reported the Model A had been the center of their own social life during their high school years.

State Interest Strong


The tour was sponsored by the Wisconsin Chapter of the Model A Ford Club of America, which has more than 400 members, according to Demo Staver, one of the founders in 1955. Wisconsin was one of the largest chapters in the country, and there also is another group centering at Wisconsin Rapids. Staver, of 1920 Highland Dr., Elm Grove, called this "good Model A country."

For the arrival, Richard Baumann, proprietor of the store, and fellow merchants had arranged to have the street barricaded, leaving space for parking and comparing Model A's.






