

Santa has asked for a limit of 12 yr of age for gifts.



TECHNICAL SEMINAR

This article is copied from the Spring, 2008 issue of *MODEL A TIMES* for those members that have asked about manifold problems. *Model A Times* is dedicated to researching and comparing new parts and processes in the Model A Ford hobby. It is published with a subscription rate of \$25.00 for four issues a year.

NEW MANIFOLDS

New Intake and Exhaust Manifolds are now available from most Model A Parts suppliers. The exhaust manifold is U.S. made and the Intake Manifold is foreign made. The two new manifolds are a perfect match with each other.





With the two manifolds bolted together, and a straight edge placed across all six ports (dashed line on photograph above), the intake ports line up near perfect with the exhaust ports. No machine surfacing is necessary when using these two manifolds together.

When mating an original intake manifold to the new exhaust manifold, machine surfacing may be required to provide a flat mating surface across all six ports. All ports of the two manifolds must be the same height ±.005".

A difference in height between the two manifold ports can cause a mounting ear to crack on either manifold or the exhaust or intake manifold ports will leak, causing poor engine performance.

The same problem can occur when trying to mate an original exhaust manifold to a new intake manifold. The original exhaust manifold exhaust ports will not align with the intake

> ports. This could cause the intake manifold ports to leak air, causing poor idling and loss of power.

A new exhaust manifold can make a satisfactory match with an original intake manifold by bolting the two together and surface machining to port surface to bring them to the same height.

The best matchup is to use the new exhaust manifold with the new intake manifold. All ports will be in straight alignment, allowing the manifold gasket to seal around all six port correctly. The manifold clamp ring on the exhaust manifold has been precision machined to fit the bell on the exhaust/muffler pipe. This will allow for proper mating of the muffler pipe for a leak free seal when using a muffler sealant.




Both manifolds are available from most Model A parts suppliers.



This month in History

October 1, 1908 - Henry Ford's Model T, a "universal car" designed for the masses, went on sale for the first time.

October 5, 1921-The World Series was broadcast on the radio for the first time.

October 8, 1871 The Great Fire of Chicago started. That same day in Peshtigo, Wis., the worst forest fire in U.S. history also began.

October 17, 1933- Albert Einstein arrived in the United States as a refugee from Nazi Germany.

October 24, 1929 - "Black Thursday" occurred in the New York Stock Exchange as nearly 13 million shares were sold in panic selling. Five days later "Black Tuesday" saw 16 million shares sold.

October 24, 1931 - Chicago gangster "Scarface" Al Capone was sentenced to 11 years in jail for federal income tax evasion. In 1934, he was transferred to Alcatraz prison near San Francisco. He was paroled in 1939, suffering from syphilis. He retired to his mansion in Miami Beach where he died in 1947.

October 29, 1929 - The stock market crashed as over 16 million shares were dumped amid tumbling prices. The Great Depression followed and spread worldwide, lasting until the outbreak of World War II.

With the Presidential election on Nov. 4th here are some fun Presidential Facts



- There are 132 rooms, 35 bathrooms, and 6 levels in the Residence. There are also 412 doors, 147 windows, 28 fireplaces, 8 staircases, and 3 elevators.
- James Buchanan is the only bachelor to be elected president.
- At various times in history, the White House has been known as the "President's Palace," the
 "President's House," and the "Executive Mansion." President Theodore Roosevelt officially gave
 the White House its current name in 1901.
- Presidential Firsts while in office... President James Polk (1845-49) was the first President to have his photograph taken... President Theodore Roosevelt (1901-09) was not only the first President to ride in an automobile, but also the first President to travel outside the country when he visited Panama... President Franklin Roosevelt (1933-45) was the first President to ride in an airplane.
- With five full-time chefs, the White House kitchen is able to serve dinner to as many as 140 guests and hors d'oeuvres to more than 1,000.
- Ronald Reagan is the only divorced man to be elected president.
- The White House requires 570 gallons of paint to cover its outside surface.
- For recreation, the White House has a variety of facilities available to its residents, including a tennis court, jogging track, swimming pool, movie theater, and bowling lane.
- George W. Bush is the nation's 43rd president but in reality there have only been 42 presidents.
 Grover Cleveland is counted twice as our 22nd and 24th president because he was elected for two nonconsecutive terms.
- Only 12 U.S. Presidents have been elected to office for two terms and served those two terms. Franklin D. Roosevelt was elected to office four terms prior to the Twenty-second Amendment.
- John Kennedy is the youngest elected U.S. President at 43.
 Ronald Reagan is the oldest elected U.S. President at 73. (second term)

- The U.S. Marine band has played at every presidential inauguration since 1801.
- Victoria Woodhull became the first woman to run for President in 1872.


