Fermentation Tour

We will meet at McDonalds, S71 W23466 National Ave, Big Bend, Wisconsin on **Sunday, October 11, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.** for some

Brightonwoods Orchard in Burlington Wisconsin. The orchard was established in 1950 and they have over 4000 dwarf and semi-dwarf fruit trees. They grow many different types of produce such as apples, grapes, quince and pears. Items that can be **fermented** in to alcohol. At the peak of the season they have 40 varieties of apples available. Brightonwoods Orchard has over 200 heirloom apple varieties and the apple selection change's weekly, depending on the ripening and picking schedule. Brightonwoods' emphasis is on preserving existing heirloom varieties and growing standard and newer commercial varieties. Apple cider is also made on site and is available. We'll be able to walk around the orchard, visit the apple barn, and stroll through the wooded trails. They are especially beautiful when the leaves are changing color

A collaborative venture with **AeppelTreow Winery** began in 2001 and they are also on site. We'll be able to stop there also. AeppelTreow Winery & Distillery is a producer of small batch cider, perry and spirits. The winery specializes in apple and pear fruit wines, hard ciders and dessert wines. An on-site distillery allows the winery to also produce special brandies and sorghum whiskey. We will be able to sample up to five samples for free. For instance, something in each style, limit one distilled item. per person, but couples may share if they choose.

PAST EVENTS IN OUR REARVIEW MIRROR......

Wisconsin Chapter 2020 Memorial Overnighter September 4 - 7, 2020 By Jan Olsen

Since we were starting a Model A tour, we thought it appropriate A Model A Ford should be the leader for our Wisconsin Chapter 2020 Memorial Overnighter on Labor Day Weekend. The 1930 Model A Town Sedan was followed by a 1965 Mustang, 1970 Thunderbird and 2013 Ford Edge. Our Ford vehicles journey began at Kwik Trip in Oconomowoc on a sunny and clear day with perfect temperatures.

We took a quick ride across the Wisconsin River on the Merrimac Ferry. We stopped at the Log Cabin in Baraboo for A delicious lunch. Then we had to try some pie to see if it was a tasty as we were told. It was!

The Model A Ford continued leading us towards La Crosse on excellent Model A roads taking off from Hwy 33. You do know what is a Model A road? It's the twisting zigging up high, zagging down low, and zig zagging back and forth road. It's the blacktop road that challenges you to get to the top and back down again only to repeat the ups and downs and zig zags again and again and again!........Again!!

We started out early Saturday morning with the idea to stop at Bloedow's Bakery in Winona, Minnesota to purchase bakery goodies. However, as we turned the corner close to Bloedow's, we noticed a long line of people that was continuing to grow much longer as we drove closer. We decided we didn't need bakery because we had to be down the road in an hour. Later we found out long lines happen lots of days at this bakery!!

We arrived at the National Eagle Center in Wabasha, MN, where we had reservations for a 90 minute self guided tour. The Center has many interesting displays and short videos about eagles. It was a privilege to see three live eagles. These were eagles that could not be released back into the wild because they would not be able to survive on their own.

We crossed the Mississippi River back to Wisconsin and headed towards Alma. In Alma we began traveling on another Model A Road. We saw a sign for Danzinger Winery about half way up the hill, so we pulled in to give our vehicles a break. Cheese and crackers were enjoyed by all while we taste tested several varieties of wine. It was A beautiful Wisconsin Saturday afternoon sitting in the light breeze on their patio overlooking the Mississippi River.

We continued on our scenic Model A Road to see Soldiers Walk in Veterans Memorial Park in Arcadia, WI. This park is a tribute to veterans of all wars and conflicts. There are many exceptional memorial statues of fighting men and women who paid the supreme sacrifice for the freedom we enjoy today. This is a beautiful and peaceful area and it was well worth the time to walk through the park.

Early Sunday morning there was lots of thunder and rain. Fortunately, the rain stopped, started to clear, was almost dried up by 8 a.m., and appearing to be a nice day. We got together about 9:00 a.m. to discuss what we wanted to do. Since the discussion took a while, we decided to consider lunch as we were closing in on lunch time. Buzzard Billy's in downtown La Crosse served us a leisurely lunch. Then, to complete our afternoon we found more Model A roads for us to travel on.

Monday we started back home retracing our original drive under overcast skies, but did not have any rain. It was A perfect Model A overnighter!


