





This year marks the 100th anniversary of the introduction of the Model T Ford. This automobile was the embodiment of all the things Henry Ford thought were important in an automobile. This also marks the 25th annual Hill and Valley Antique Auto and Americana Show. We believe this show to be unique above all other car-related shows in that it is actually a celebration of America's heritage and history represented through our historic displays and demonstrations of crafts and skills that include blacksmithing, wheel making, quilt making, spinning, lace making, sauerkraut making, woodcarving and historical society displays.

THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO, 1983 - Our club and the Chevy Club ran a joint Economy run. First Place - Larry Koser, Second Place - Wes Campbell, Third Place - Carl Wusson. Bill Leiden received the Hard Luck Award, earned by having a broken gas line.


