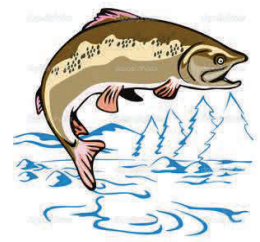

September Tour

Mark your calendars, on **Sunday September 13th, 2015** for the fishiest tours ever.



Dave and Linda Huenink will be hosting a tour to the Rushing Water Fisheries in Palmyra Wisconsin.

Departure: We will meet at the McDonald's on Highway 164 and National Ave. in Big Bend at around 9:00 a.m. for breakfast. At 10:00 a.m. we will take a scenic tour of the country side and Kettle Moraine State Forest as we head to our destination in Palmyra.

At the Rushing Water Fisheries, we will have a guided tour to the 3 trout pond's, learn how the fish eggs are hatched through their various stages of life to when the fish are ready for harvest. The ponds are 400 feet from the parking lot and the path is gravel.

If you desire to go fishing after our tour, you'll need to bring your own pole, bait, cooler and ice. The cost for this is \$9.00 a fish for the first two. If you want to fish for more than two it will be \$8.75 a pound. Rushing Waters will fillet the fish you caught and pack them in ice for you, although you will still need your own cooler and ice for the trip home.

We'll have time after the tour to visit the gift shop where you will be able to buy fresh or frozen fish as well as other food and gift items. (Bring a cooler and ice to keep your fish purchases in). Snacks and refreshments will be provided at this stop.

Then off to our next destination through the country roads to – The Elegant Farmer in Mukwonago - they are known for their excellent apple pies baked in a paper bag. The market has bakery, fresh fruits and vegetables, cheeses, selected meats and other food items. While at the market you may get a glimpse of the East Troy Electric Trolley.

RSVP's are appreciated so we can give the fishery a count of then number of club members attending.

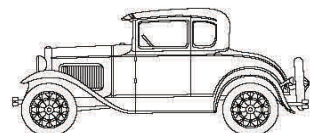

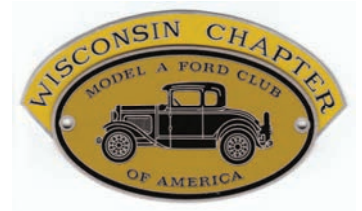

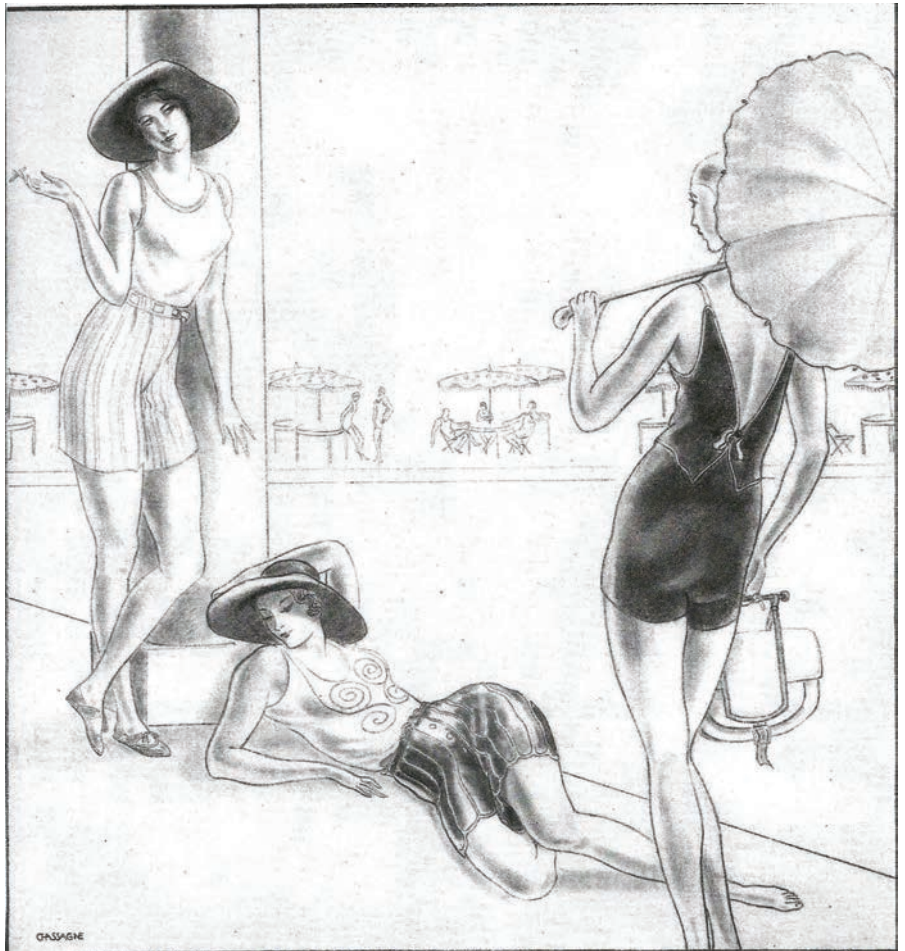
At the Biarritz Swimming Pool Harper's Bazaar, June 1930

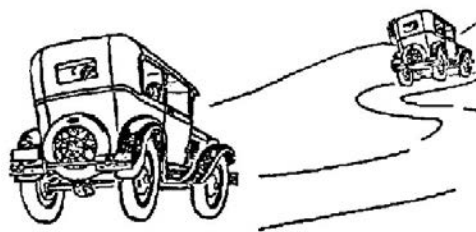

Historical Events for September 2001:

7th - The US Federal Trade Commission approves Chevron's bid to buy Texaco

9th - 121st U.S. Open: Venus Williams beats Serena Williams (6-2, 6-4)

11th - Two passenger planes hijacked by terrorists crash into New York's World Trade Towers causing the collapse of both and death of 2,752 people

11th - Terrorists hijack a passenger plane and crash it into the Pentagon causing the death of 125 people

11th - Attempt by passengers and crew of United Airlines Flight 93 to retake control of their hijacked plane from terrorists causes plane to crash in Pennsylvania field killing all 64 people onboard

12th - Article V of the NATO agreement is invoked for the first and only time in response to the September 11, 2001 attacks against the United States of America. It provides that if a NATO Ally is the victim of an armed attack, each and every other member of the Alliance will consider this act of violence as an armed attack against all members and will take the actions it deems necessary to assist the Ally attacked.

12th - Ansett Australia, Australia's first commercial interstate airline, collapses due to increased strain on the international airline industry leaving 10000 people unemployed.

13th - Civilian aircraft traffic resumes in the U.S. after the September 11, 2001 attacks.

14th - Historic National Prayer Service held at Washington National Cathedral for victims of the September 11 attacks. A similar service is held in Canada on Parliament Hill, the largest vigil ever held in the nation's capital.
