





2015 Model A Reunion Planning Meeting



President – Mike Q.- We received the newsletters from the reciprocating clubs, a thank you note from the Wauwatosa Skate Park organization for our donation of \$500. and the bill for our post office box and it can be paid on line with automatic withdrawal. We also received on expiration notice for our dominion name.

Vice President – Steve L. – There are no new members this month.

Secretary – Dave H. – There was one correction to the minutes from the July 19th, 2014, board of directors meeting. A motion was made by Dave B. and seconded by Neil B. to accept the minutes with the correction. The motion was put to a vote and it carried. 



Tiny Tip (per Sept 1998) Everyone knows what a pain it is to put 600# oil in your Model "A" differential. No funnel, hose or anything else works. The next time you caulk something with one of those throw away plastic caulking tubes, don't throw it away! Wash it out and push the plunger cap out from the front with a ¼" rod or wood dowel. Close off the tapered end with a large screw. Pour in the oil, replace the plunger cap and you can pump oil in with your caulking gun. It works very well. Continued on next page......

1901 King Gillette marketed the safety razor.

1907 invention of Bakelite, a forerunner to today's plastic

1913 invention of the zipper

1914 invention of the brassiere (which is still holding up today!)

1928 the first Model "A" and the La-Z-Boy

1930 Wonder Bread and Clarence Birdsey's quick frozen foods

1947 the first microwave oven

Well, historically speaking, it has been a cool summer – great for driving the "A", hope you were able to get yours out and enjoy the weather!



5736-Large-Hip. Only Paris could produce a frock like this one with its slim tunic effect.




Clutch Release Bearing Hub A-7561-B

A part that takes a lot of abuse is the clutch release bearing (throw out bearing) hub. This mechanism is worked over and over during any tour you take with your Model A. The service bulletin suggests that you lubricate this hub every 2000 miles. To do this you need to remove the floorboards of the Model A and I imagine many of you have never done this. I know it seems like a lot of trouble to take everything out just to get to a lube point but it is necessary. What happens when you don't do this is the hub starts to wear and creates a binding when you are attempting to push in the clutch to shift. We have seen many really worn cruddy looking hubs over the years and it was nice to see that Snyder's Antique Auto, New Springfield, OH took on the challenge and had a replacement manufactured.

As you can see in the picture the part is exactly as the original was made. The bearing surfaces and the slide part are cleanly machined to original specifications. Utilizing one of these when you change the clutch next time will greatly extend the wear of the clutch and your driving enjoyment.

It is really great that the parts suppliers to our wonderful hobby are stepping up and taking care of the parts coming into short supply and wearing out over the years of use.

Model A Tour to the Milk Source the Rosendale Dairy July 20, 2014

The Kaufman's dropped by the starting point to give us a warm send off and celebrate Wally's release from the hospital. It was a good feeling to share part of our day with them even though they were not able to make the drive.

On that warm, dry and sunny day in late July we drove from Hubertus to Rosendale to see 8,000 Holsteins and learn something about really big dairies. On the way we had a buffet lunch at Ginger's Hideaway, a favorite lunch spot for John Deere people, in Horicon. There was a planned end point at The Scoop DeVille, a family operated ice cream store with a car theme and serving fantastic ice cream made on site by Grandma.



The really great weather and scenic countryside made our trip really pleasant. We drove past the state prison in Waupun on the way up and came back along the east side of Wisconsin's largest marsh, Horicon. The drive from Hubertus to the dairy and back was 121 miles with an average speed of 36 mph. Total tour time was just a few minutes over 8 hours. There were 14 Model A's plus 6 more modern cars and a few motorcycles.

The dairy was huge with 4,000 cows in each cooled barn adjacent to the two merry-go-round milking rooms, that hold 80 cows. A cow is on the merry-go-round for just under 8 minutes. Milk is piped direct from the milker to the thermos bottle tankers via a flash cooler which drops the milk temperature from over 100° to 38° and then hauled direct to the cheese plants. It was obvious that management spent a lot of energy to make sure the cows were well fed, clean, cool and comfortable. They dairy was nearly free of the usual dairy smells.

The dairy has three cash streams: milk of course, plus fertilizer and methane to power generators.

We only lost 1/3 of the tour group on the way up but lost 2/3 on the return trip so few made it to Scoop Deville for the social time.

Attendance was great with 46 for lunch and the trip to Rosendale with more joining us at the dairy for the tour making the total about 54.
